3. How was Titus a comfort to Paul? How was the church in Corinth a comfort to Titus? How should the church be a source of comfort today?
4. How does Paul describe the difficult conversation he had with the Corinthian church in verses 8-9? What was the value of this difficult conversation?

5. Has anyone ever corrected you or spoken frankly with you so that initially you were upset, but later it turned out for your benefit? What can we learn from those times?

6. How does this passage show the importance of both accountability and grace within the church?

7. What should we learn from Paul's relationship with the Corinthians in regards to restoring relationships after a period of conflict?

8. How would you describe Titus' role throughout this section of scripture? How can we be like Titus?

9. What do you think it looks like to receive someone with fear and trembling?

10. Why was Paul able to rejoice with the church in Corinth? What reasons are we able to rejoice with one another?
