Core: Read 2 Corinthians 6:14-7:1

1. What is a yoke? Why is it an appropriate metaphor for our relationships? How does this metaphor relate to last week's description of believers as coworkers?
2. How does Paul describe the differences between believers and unbelievers?
3. Jesus said that we should be in the world but not of the world. How should followers of Jesus build healthy relationships with unbelievers without being "of the world" or "unequally yoked with unbelievers?"
4. While this principle is commonly applied to marriage, what other partnerships or relationships could it apply towards?

5. Have you ever considered yourself as “the temple of the living God?” Practically what does this mean for our lives? How does our identity as the temple of God impact our daily, personal choices regarding what we touch or participate in?

6. What kind of relationship is described in verses 16-18 between God and His people?

7. What promises are being referred to in 2 Corinthians 7:1?

8. What does it look like to “bring holiness to completion?”

9. Paul refers again to the “fear of God.” How does the fear of God relate to our pursuit of holiness?

10. If we are called to be “set apart” from the rest of the world, how can we do that while still being an effective witness to those who do not know Christ?
