Core: Read Psalm 1:1-6

1. When you read or hear the word "blessed," what comes to mind? Describe for me what a blessed person or life looks like.
2. Is there a connection between blessedness and righteousness? How are these concepts connected?
3. The Psalmist seems to describe a progression of sin in people's lives. What happens when people move from walking around sin to standing in sin to sitting in sin?
4. What are the "voices" or influences in your life that resemble the "counsel of the wicked," and how can you counter them?

5. What does it mean to “delight” in the law of the Lord, rather than just reading God’s Word?

6. What practical steps can you take to meditate on God’s law day and night?

7. Why are people growing in God described like a tree? What happens when a tree is healthy? What about when it is sick? What does it mean that a believer bears fruit?

8. How does the imagery of “chaff” describe the long-term result of a life not rooted in God?

9. According to verses 5-6 what is the destiny of the wicked? What about the righteous?

10. How do you feel after reading this Psalm, and why do you think you feel that way?
