Core: Read Ephesians 6:1-9

- 3. Lance mentioned this quote in the Sunday message, "When you are baptized, we give up the right to ever say 'No' to Jesus about anything." What comes to mind when you hear this quote?
- 4. Is the concept of honoring your mother and father different from obeying them? How? What is the promise associated with honoring your parents?

5.	What responsibilites are prescribed to fathers in this passage? Why do you think Paul addresses only "fathers" in v.4? How should fathers instruct & discipline their children?
6.	What instructions does Paul offer to Christian slaves? How are they to serve thei masters?
7.	Are their principles we can draw from Paul's instructions to slaves in the first century that we should apply in the 21st century?
8.	What instructions does Paul offer to masters? What do you think Paul means when he says "do the same things"? What is Paul requiring of masters and why?
9.	Are their principles we can draw from Paul's instructions to masters in the first century that we should apply in the 21st century?
10	Where do we find the power to live out this vision for Christ-centered relationships?
