Core: Read Ephesians 6:10-24

1. What does it look like to be "strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might?" How does Ephesians 3:16 help us understand this command?
2. What does Paul want us to understand about the battle we face as Christians?
3. What is the difference between using our own strength and being strong in God's might?
4. What reasons does Paul give for putting on the full armor of God?

5. How do words like “stand” and “wrestle” inform your understanding of spiritual warfare?
6. How would you describe the enemy as described in verse 12?
7. Discuss the different pieces of armor in verses 13-17. What are some ways that we fail to stand in truth? In what ways is faith a shield? In what ways is the Word of God like a sword?
8. The breastplate protected the heart. How has your heart been wounded by any of these things? What tactics has Satan used to try to exploit this weakness and get a foothold in your life?
9. What has been one of the most meaningful places where you have heard and learned from God’s word on a consistent basis?
10. How should the reality of spiritual battle affect the way a Christian prays?
