
GOT QUESTIONS WITH NO ANSWERS

"Why, God?"

Job, the Book of Questions

Job 1:1-12 Rev. Steve Vaughn September 14, 2025







In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was blameless and upright; he feared God and shunned evil.

He had seven sons and three daughters, and he owned seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen and five hundred donkeys, and had a large number of servants. He was the greatest man among all the people of the East.



His sons used to hold feasts in their homes on their birthdays, and they would invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. When a period of feasting had run its course, Job would make arrangements for them to be purified. Early in the morning he would sacrifice a burnt offering for each of them, thinking, "Perhaps my children have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." This was Job's regular custom.

Job 1:1-5 NIV

Blameless – being blameless in the Bible means to be innocent of wrongdoing and without guilt.

Upright – to be upright is to walk with God; to lead our lives as in the presence and sight of God.

Feared God - fearing God comes from understanding who God is and that He is holy, just and righteous.

Shunned evil – to shun something is to deliberately avoid something or someone. In the Bible, the word shun is applied to evil.



JOB'S FIRST QUESTION: Am I doing enough to intercede for my kids?



Keep their hearts and salvation in front of God by what you do, not by what they do, always.



One day the angels came to present themselves before the Lord, and Satan also came with them. The Lord said to Satan, "Where have you come from?"

Satan answered the Lord, "From roaming throughout the earth, going back and forth on it."

Then the Lord said to Satan, "Have you considered my servant Job? There is no one on earth like him; he is blameless and upright, a

man who fears God and shuns evil."

"Does Job fear God for nothing?" Satan replied "Have you not put a hedge around him and his household and everything he has? You have blessed the work of his hands, so that his flocks and herds are spread throughout the land. But now stretch out your hand and strike everything he has, and he will surely curse you to your face."



The Lord said to Satan, "Very well, then, everything he has is in your power, but on the man himself do not lay a finger."

Then Satan went out from the presence of the Lord.
