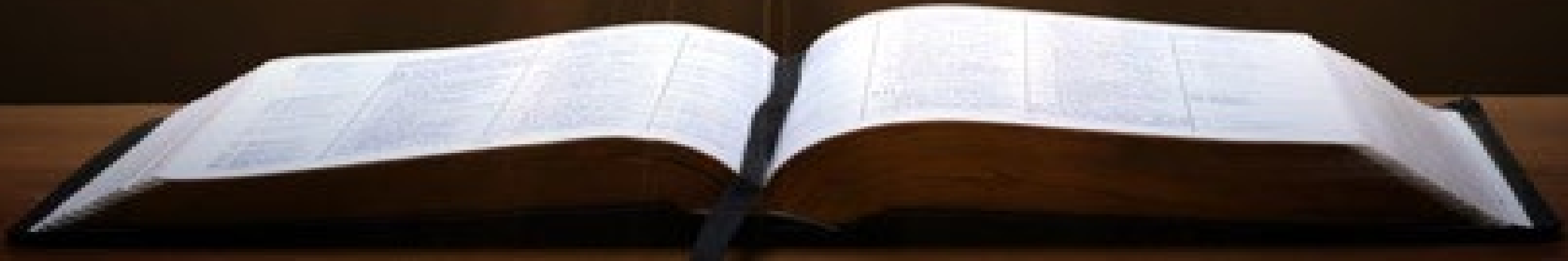

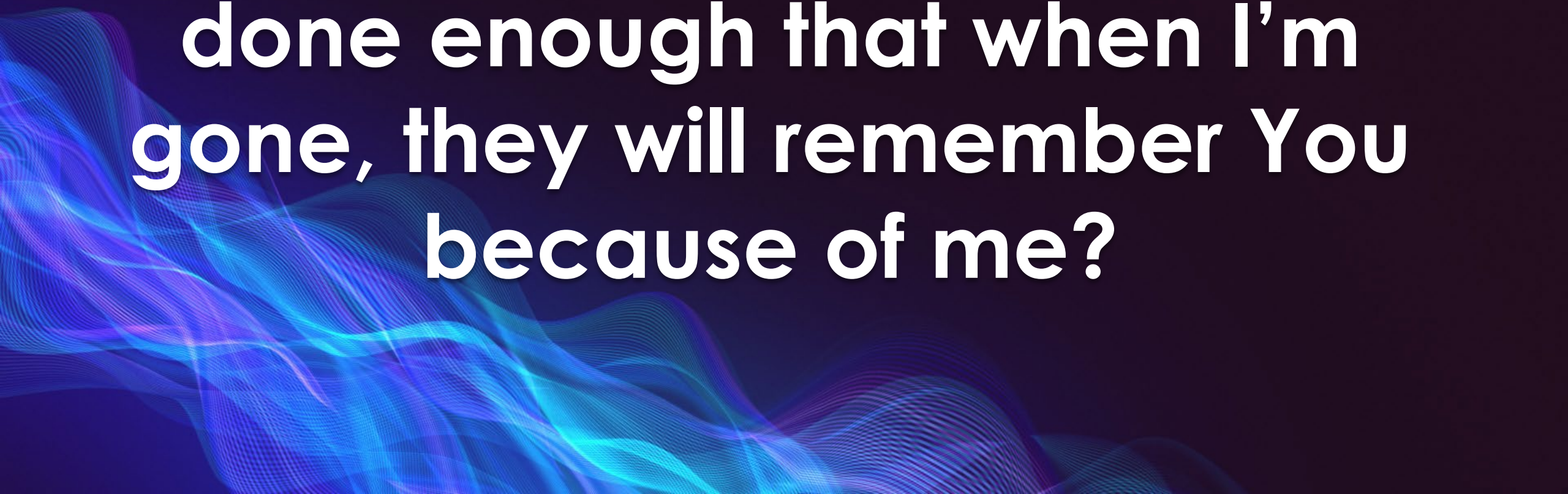

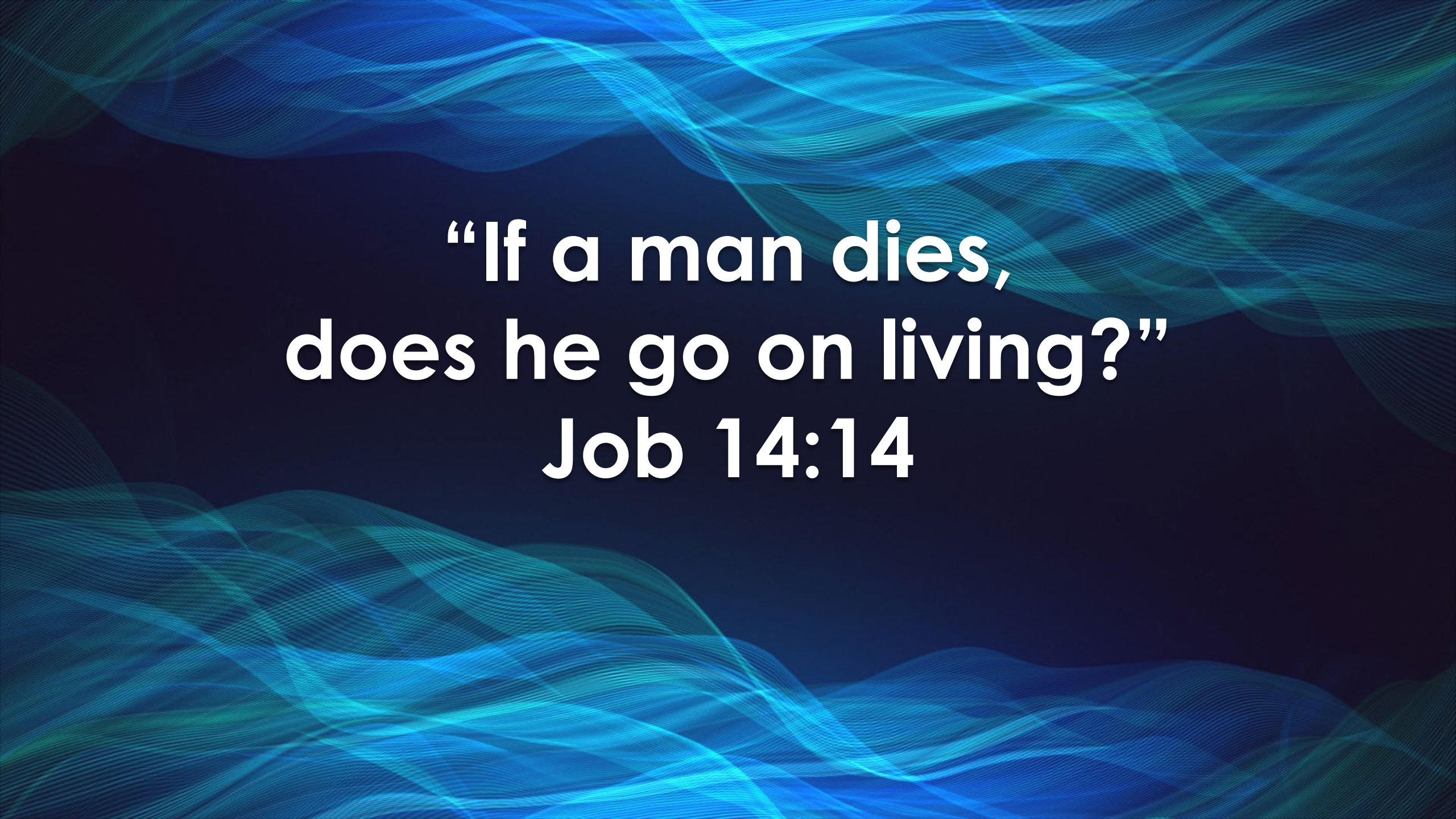


According to Lifeway Research, prior to the pandemic, only 39% of US Evangelicals believed you should worship alone. Now 54% think worship alone in your home is theologically solid.

Almost 7 in 10 Americans (67%) say God accepts the worship of all religions, including Christianity, Judaism and Islam.

58% of U.S. adults disagree, a growing number believe God is unconcerned with their day-to-day decisions. Around a third of Americans (32%) say God isn't concerned with what they do on a daily basis, up from 25% in 2020 and the highest since the State of Theology first asked the question in 2014.

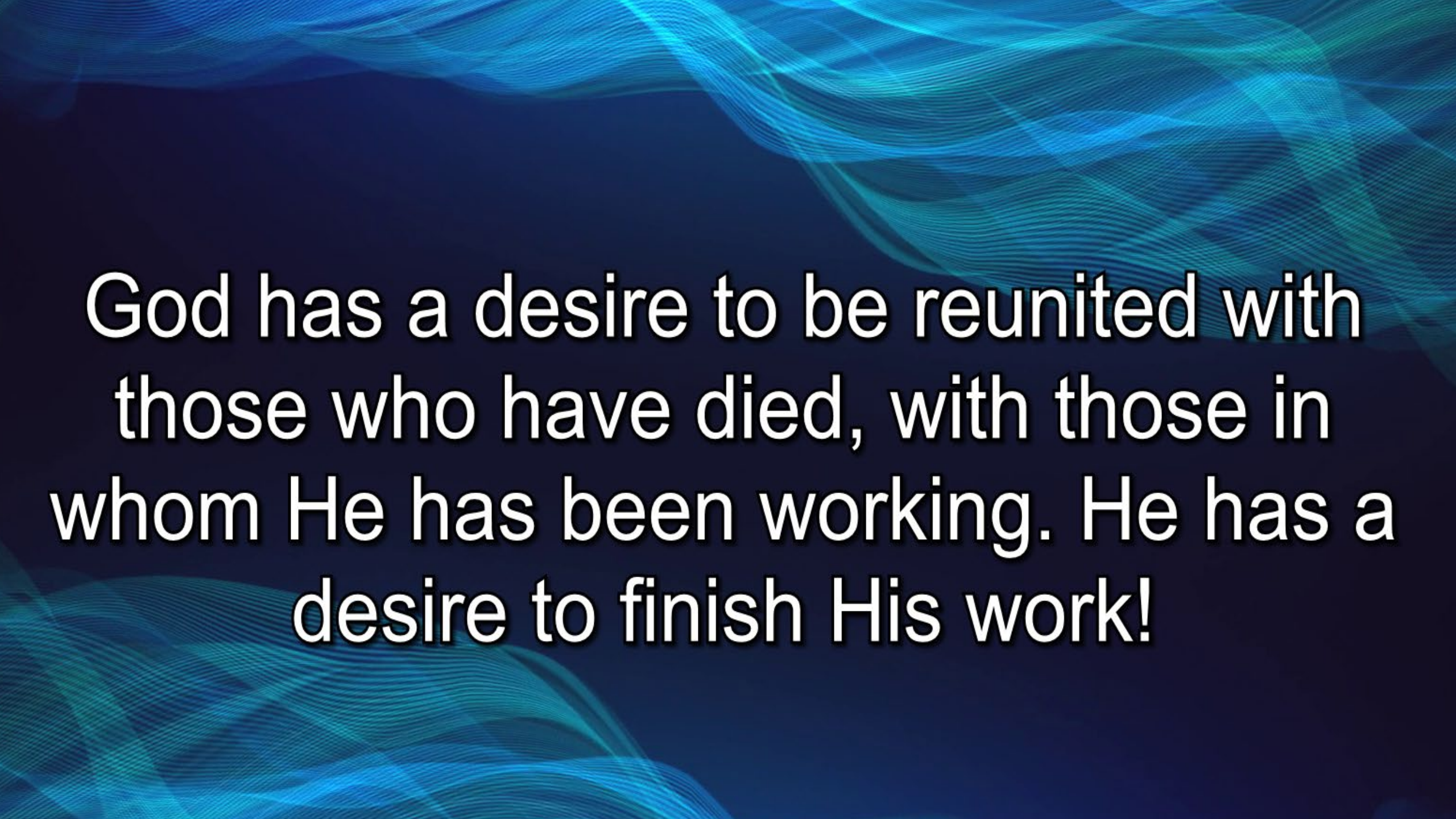
When thinking about these theological convictions, most Americans classify them as opinions not facts. For 60% of U.S. adults, religious belief is a matter of personal opinion; it's not objective truth.

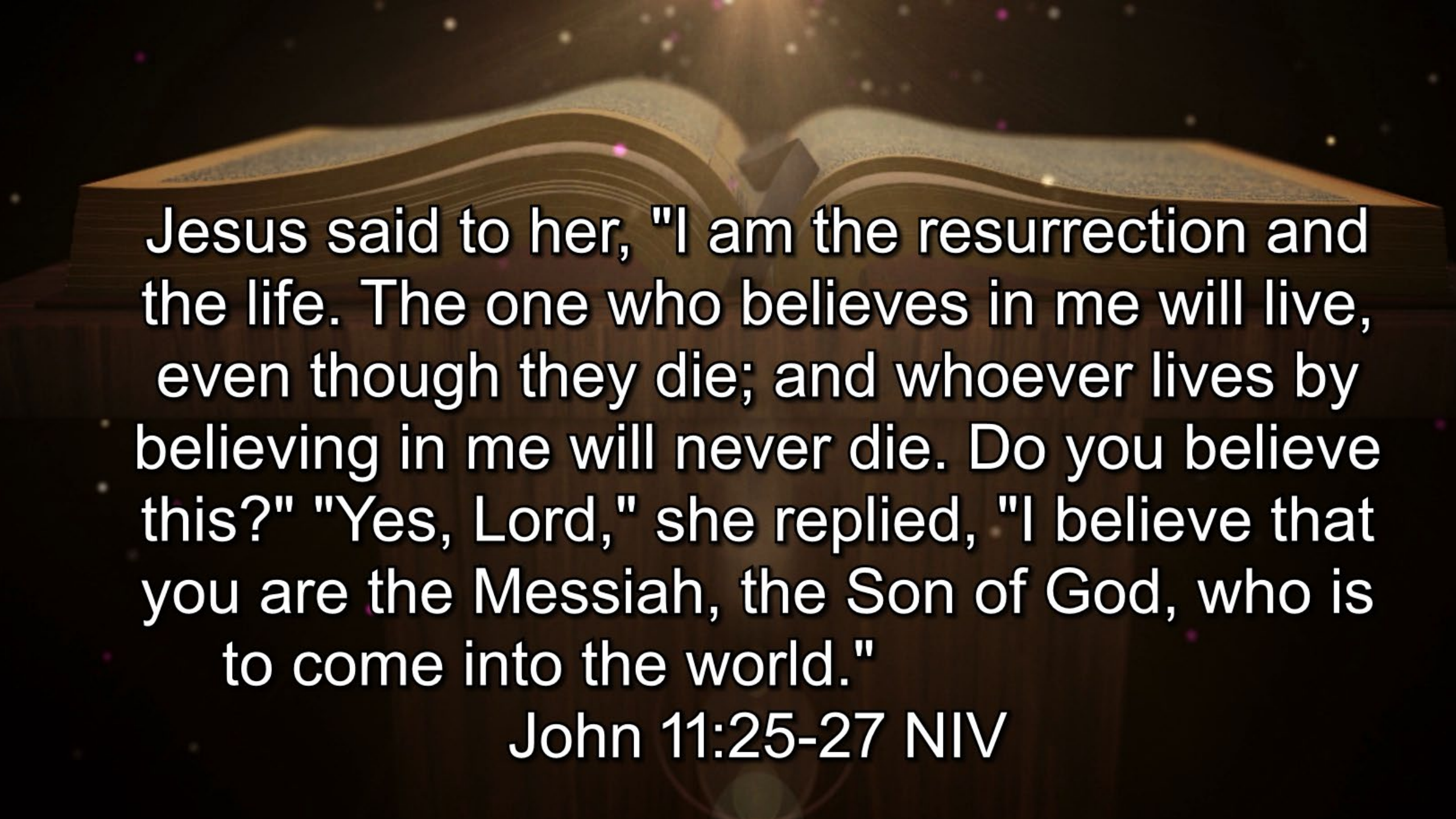
**WILL MY LIFE GO ON LIVING
