JACOB'S NEW CHANGE CAME TO HIM AS A RESULT OF A SPRITUAL STRUGGLE.

All Struggles create stimulation in our growth or stagnate our situation.



Spiritual growth can take you in a good direction, but often that good direction requires a struggle.

AND EVEN MORE DIFFICULT IS THE GROWTH CREATED BY CHANGES IN OUR LIFE SITUATIONS.
