Jesus in Genesis
"Jesus and the End"
Revelation 22:13-21; May 18, 2014

Sunday May 18	Scripture: Genesis 2:4-4:26 Prayer: Ask the Holy Spirit to keep asking you, "Why?" "Why are you doing what you are doing? Is it for God's glory? Is Jesus the end, the goal, the object of your efforts?"
