2.15.26 - SERMON RECAP:

Today we continue in our series: Disciples of Jesus. As we look at I Peter 1:14-21 the apostle Peter encourages us to know that we've been ransomed by Jesus, in that He shed His blood and died for our sin. In this ransom, we've been set free from our Old Master (satan, sin and death) to a New Master (our Father and King) to live with new marching orders for our lives. May we stay motivated to live for our King in light of His great love for us. May we consider a few deeper questions and discussion that will help us apply this passage in our lives!! Lets read I Peter 1:14-21 together.

DIGGING DEEPER:

1. Peter calls believers "obedient children" before commanding holy conduct. How does remembering your identity as a beloved child guard you from legalism and spiritual laziness?
2. Being "ransomed" means being purchased out from one master and placed under another. What is the "Old Master" and who is the New Master for the believer?? Related passages: Romans 6:17-22; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20.
3. In what areas of life do you still feel tension between old allegiances and your new Master?
4. Verse 17 calls us to live with reverent fear during our exile. What does healthy, reverent fear of God look like in everyday decisions, and how is it different from shame-based fear? Related passages: Hebrews 12:28-29; Philippians 2:12-13
5. Peter contrasts perishable silver and gold with the precious blood of Christ. What does this contrast reveal about how heaven values your soul compared to how the world assigns worth? Related passages: Hebrews 9:12-14; Ephesians 1:7
6. This Sunday we shared a vivid image: the King stepping forward and paying your ransom with His own life. How does meditating on this reality reshape your motivation for obedience to Jesus in our holy living this week? Related passages: 2 Corinthians 5:14-15; John 15:13-14
7. Peter says we were ransomed from "futile ways inherited from your forefathers." What inherited patterns—family, cultural, generational—might Christ be calling you to break by His grace? Related passages: Ephesians 4:17-24; Colossians 3:5-10
8. We were asked whether we have truly had a "crisis moment" of surrender—presenting ourselves fully to our new King. Have you experienced that decisive surrender? If so, how is it being renewed daily? Related passages: Romans 6:11-13; Luke 9:23
9. How do we practically "stay motivated by our King's amazing love" rather than drifting into performance-driven Christianity? What rhythms help keep your heart warm toward the gospel? Related passages: Titus 2:11-14; 1 John 4:9-11
