## 4.5.26 - SERMON RECAP:

This Easter message from Luke 24:13–35 reminds us that it's possible to know about Jesus yet still miss truly seeing Him as the risen King in our lives. Through the truth of God's Word and a personal response of faith, our eyes can be opened to recognize Jesus, trust Him, and walk with Him daily. As we fix our gaze on Him and invite Him into every part of our lives, we are transformed and sent out to follow Him with renewed faith, clarity, and purpose. Read Luke 24:13-35 together, and chat through these questions to dig deeper into the Ways of Jesus' Kingdom...

## DIGGING DEEPER:

1. Read: Luke 24:13–16; John 20:29. These two disciples knew a lot about Jesus, yet didn't recognize Him. What is the difference between knowing about Jesus and truly knowing Him? Where might you be relying on knowledge about Jesus rather than relationship with Him?
2. Luke 24:16; II Corinthians 4:3–4. The sermon highlights that our eyes can be spiritually blinded. What are some ways spiritual blindness shows up in our lives today? What might be hindering your ability to clearly see Jesus right now?
3. Luke 24:21; John 18:36. The disciples expected a political or earthly kingdom, and this limited their understanding of Jesus. How can our expectations of God cause us to miss what He is actually doing? Where might your expectations of God need to be reshaped?

5. Luke 24:22–24; Colossians 3:1–2. How does focusing primarily on the physical world (circumstances, culture, fears) hinder our ability to see spiritual truth? What is currently capturing most of your attention—earthly concerns or spiritual kingdom realities?
6. Luke 24:25–27; Hebrews 4:12. Jesus opened the Scriptures to reveal Himself. Why is the Word of God essential for truly seeing and knowing Jesus?
7. Luke 24:25; James 1:22. Jesus calls them “slow of heart to believe.” What are some reasons we can be slow to believe God's truth even when we hear it clearly? Is there an area where you know truth but are struggling to believe or act on it?
8. Luke 24:28–29; Revelation 3:20. The disciples invited Jesus to stay with them. What does it mean to actively invite Jesus into your life—not just once, but continually?
9. Luke 24:30–31; Ephesians 1:17–18. Their eyes were opened in a moment. What role do both God's work and our response play in truly seeing Jesus? When have you experienced a moment where God made truth come alive to you?
