5.3.26 - SERMON RECAP:

This week we continue in our series: Disciples of Jesus- looking at I Peter 3:8-12. Sunday's message calls all of us as followers of Jesus to live with unity, compassion, and humility, reflecting Christ in how we relate to one another. Instead of returning evil for evil, we are called to be a blessing in every situation, using our words and actions to pursue peace and do good. As we live this way, we demonstrate the transforming power of the gospel and grow together as a people who represent Jesus well in everyday life. Read 1 Peter 3:1-7 together, and chat through these questions to dig deeper into the Ways of Jesus' Kingdom...

DIGGING DEEPER:

1. Read: I Peter 3:8; Galatians 3:28 - Peter emphasizes "all of you." Why is it important to see these commands as applying to every believer, not just certain people in the church? Where are you tempted to think these commands apply more to others than to you?
2. Read: Philippians 2:1-2 - What does true unity look like in a diverse church where people have different opinions, backgrounds, and preferences?
3. Read Philippians 2:3-5 - Where do pride or self-centered thinking tend to show up in your relationships?
4. Read: I Peter 3:9; Romans 12:14-21-Peter calls us to bless even when we are wronged. Why is this so difficult, and what does it reveal about our hearts?
5. Think of a recent situation where you were hurt—how could you respond with blessing?
6. Read: Matthew 5:44 - Our sermon highlighted that God's people are called to be a blessing. What does that look like in everyday, practical ways? What is one intentional way you can be a blessing to someone this week?
7. Read: I Peter 3:10; James 3:5-10 - Why does Peter place such strong emphasis on controlling our speech? Where do you most struggle—with gossip, harsh words, sarcasm, or dishonesty?
8. Read: I Peter 3:11; Romans 12:9 - What is the difference between simply avoiding evil and actively pursuing good? What is one "good" you sense God calling you to actively pursue??
9. Read: I Peter 3:11; Hebrews 12:14 - Peter says to seek and pursue peace. Why does peace require effort and intentionality? Is there a relationship in your life where you need to pursue peace?
10. Read: I Peter 3:12; Matthew 6:6 - Peter reminds us that God sees, hears, and responds. How does living with an awareness of God's presence shape our behavior?
11. How might your daily choices change if you lived more consciously before God?
