6.21.26 - *SERMON RECAP:*

This week we continue in our series: Disciples of Jesus—looking at 1 Peter 5:5-7. Peter calls all believers to clothe themselves with humility, not merely as an attitude, but as a practical way of life. Authentic humility is expressed in how we treat one another, how we respond to anxiety and uncertainty, and ultimately in how we follow the example of Jesus, who humbled Himself for our salvation. Read 1 Peter 5:5-7 together and consider some discussion questions to allow this passage to change our every day lives!

DIGGING DEEPER:

1. Read: I Peter 5:5; Colossians 3:12. Peter tells believers to "clothe yourselves" with humility. Why do you think he uses the imagery of putting on clothing rather than simply telling us to be humble?
2. Where do you most struggle to practice humility—in family relationships, ministry, work, friendships, or church life?
3. Read: I Peter 5:5; James 4:6. Peter reminds us that "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." Why is pride often easier to see in others than in ourselves?
4. What are some subtle signs that pride may be influencing your attitude, decisions, relationships?
5. Read: I Peter 5:5; Romans 12:16. Peter wrote to believers facing uncertainty, suffering, and disruption. How do difficult seasons reveal either humility or pride in our hearts?
6. When life feels out of control, what is your typical response?
7. Read: I Peter 5:6; Proverbs 3:5–6. What does it practically mean to humble yourself under God's mighty hand? Is there an area of your life where you are resisting God's leadership or struggling to trust His timing?
8. Read: I Peter 5:6–7; Matthew 6:25–34. Why do you think Peter connects humility with casting our anxieties on God? What is the relationship between the two?
9. What anxiety are you currently carrying that God may be inviting you to release to Him?
10. How can you develop a habit of bringing your concerns to God before bringing them to others?
11. What circumstance in your life needs to be viewed through the lens of God's care and love?
12. Peter's challenge is deeply practical: Clothe yourself with humility toward others, humble yourself before God, and cast your anxieties upon Him because He genuinely cares for you.
13. Consider two last application questions: Where is pride currently competing with humility in your life? What anxiety do you need to place into God's hands today?
