## 8.31.25 - *SERMON RECAP*:

Grab your Bibles and turn to John 19:16-37. This past Sunday we reflected the Atonement of Jesus Christ, and the powerful implications that shape our lives each and every day. In the Atonement Jesus was the absolute substitute for our sin. Paid in full. Because our sin has been dealt with, we are secure in Christ and we must learn to adamantly live-out of our new identity in Christ. May we come to talk through these questions as a way to further apply this passage into our everyday lives- as Disciples of Jesus! (As a group, lets take turns reading this scripture together; and then ponder/discuss these questions for our lives.)

## **DIGGING DEEPER:**

- 1. What does "It is finished" mean for my relationship to sin, and how should that shape my daily walk in holiness?
- 2. Romans 6:6-7 says "We know that our old self was crucified with him... so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin." If Christ truly finished the work of breaking sin's power, how am I walking in that freedom today?
- 3.2 Corinthians 5:17 "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." How would my choices look different today if I fully embraced my identity as a new creation in Christ?
- 4. If Jesus finished the work of reconciliation, how am I participating in the ministry of reconciliation Paul speaks of?
- 5. Since Christ's work is finished, am I resting in grace or still trying to earn what Jesus already paid for?
- 6. What does the finished work of Christ say about my suffering and trials as a follower of lesus?
- 7. How does Jesus' finished work empower me to live with hope and endurance in a broken world?
- 8. If the debt has been paid in full, how am I responding in love, worship, and service to Jesus as my King and Savior?
