8.30.26 - SERMON RECAP:

As we look at the local church as a Family On Mission we must consider the distinctive of being 'A Generous Steward'. The early church understood that what they possessed ultimately belonged to God and was entrusted to them for the good of others. Their generosity was not simply about giving money; it flowed from transformed hearts, deep unity, love for one another, and a willingness to use their possessions and resources so that practical needs within the body were met. Read Acts 4:32-35 together and discuss these questions and truth to transform us!

DIGGING DEEPER:

1. Read: Acts 4:32; I Peter 4:10–11. Luke says the believers were "of one heart and soul" and that no one claimed that their possessions were ultimately their own. What does this reveal about how the gospel had changed their understanding of ownership?
2. What possessions, resources, abilities, or opportunities do you tend to think of primarily as "mine" rather than something God has entrusted to you?
3. Read: Acts 4:32–35; Romans 12:1–8. What does it look like to become a generous steward of not only our money, but also our time, abilities, homes, relationships, influence, and spiritual gifts? Which is easiest for you to give—money, time, abilities, possessions, or encouragement?
4. Read: Luke 12:13–21; Matthew 6:19–24. Jesus repeatedly warns about the danger of allowing possessions to possess us. Why can our relationship with money and possessions become a spiritual issue rather than merely a financial one?
5. What do your spending, saving, giving, and use of your time reveal about what you value most?
6. Read: II Corinthians 9:6–11; Philippians 4:19. Paul connects generosity with trusting God's provision. Why can it be difficult to give freely when we are worried about having enough for ourselves? Where might God be asking you to trust Him more deeply with your resources?
7. Read: II Corinthians 8:9; Philippians 2:5–8. How should the generosity of Jesus shape the way we think about giving ourselves and our resources to others?
8. How does remembering what Christ has already given for you change your motivation for generosity?
9. If God evaluated your stewardship based on what He has entrusted specifically to you, where would you feel encouraged? Where might He be challenging you to grow?
10. What is one specific change you could make this week that would help you become a more generous steward?
