- 1. Islam teaches that salvation depends on works and obedience to Allah, not faith alone. How do passages like Ephesians 2:8–9 and 2 Corinthians 5:21 reinforce that salvation is a gift of God and not earned by human effort?
- 2. Muslims view Jesus as a prophet, not God. Why is it essential to your faith that Jesus is fully God and fully man (John 1:1, 14; Colossians 2:9)? How does this shape your understanding of salvation?
- 3. Islam rejects original sin and teaches that humans are born morally neutral. How does Romans 3:23 and Psalm 51:5 help you understand humanity's need for God's grace from birth?
- 4. The Qur'an is considered by Muslims to be the final, perfect revelation, and sometimes takes priority over the Bible. How can studying the Bible and cross-referencing Scripture give you confidence in God's Word (2 Timothy 3:16–17; Psalm 19:7)?

5. Loving your Muslim neighbors is crucial, even when beliefs differ. How can
you practically show Christ-like love this week—through actions, words, or
service—so that your Muslim friends may see Jesus in you (John 13:34–35;
Romans 2:4)?
