- 1. In what ways has God's law exposed areas of sin in your heart that you might have otherwise overlooked? (Romans 7:7–8)
- 2. Do you find yourself trusting in your own efforts to keep the law, or are you relying on Christ alone for your salvation? (Philippians 3:7–9)
- How does understanding that the law is holy, righteous, and good change your attitude toward God's commandments? (Romans 7:12)
- 4. Are there desires or attitudes in your heart—like coveting—that you need to confess before God today? (Exodus 20:17)
- 5. When confronted by your sin, are you quick to make excuses, or do you humble yourself and seek God's mercy? (Luke 18:13–14)

- 6. How can you let the law lead you to a deeper appreciation of God's grace and the work of Christ on the cross? (Galatians 3:24)
- 7. Are you tempted to see God's law as a burden, or do you view it as a reflection of His holy and loving character? (Psalm 19:8–9)
- 8. How does the gospel motivate you to pursue a transformed life, not just outward obedience, but a heart that loves God and others? (Matthew 22:37–39)
- 9. Read the take home questions. Which one challenged you or encouraged you the most? Why? How will you live differently this week based on what you learned from this passage?
