- 1. Where do you find yourself returning to old patterns of sin, and how does Proverbs 26:11 challenge your perspective on those habits?
- 2. Are you relying on your own strength to overcome sin, or are you daily seeking the Spirit's power? (Galatians 5:16)
- 3. Do you truly delight in God's law, or do you find yourself resisting His commands? (Romans 7:22)
- 4. When you feel defeated by sin, do you remember that there is no condemnation for those in Christ? (Romans 8:1)
- 5. How does the ongoing struggle with sin remind you of your need for Christ's deliverance? (Romans 7:24-25)

- 6. Are you growing in sanctification, or are you stalled in spiritual immaturity? (Galatians 5:16-17)
- 7. How does the reality of indwelling sin keep you humble and dependent on God's grace? (1 John 1:8)
- 8. Are you pressing forward in faith, trusting that the Holy Spirit will help you put to death the deeds of the body? (Romans 8:13)
- 9. Read the take home questions. Which one challenges you or encourages you the most? Why? How will you live your life differently based on what you learned from this passage?
