- 5. In what ways am I actively loving God with all my heart, soul, and mind? (Matthew 22:37–38)

- 6. How am I demonstrating love for my neighbor in practical ways this week? (Matthew 22:39–40; Romans 13:10)
- 7. When faced with temptation, do I remember that the Spirit has changed my desires and direction, enabling me to walk in obedience? (Ezekiel 36:27; Galatians 5:16)
- 8. Does my life show evidence of the fruit of the Spirit, or am I still trying to "decorate" my life with external rule-keeping? (Galatians 5:22–23)
- 9. Read the take home questions which one encourages me or challenges me the most? Why? How can I live differently this week based on what I have learned from this passage?
