Application Questions

James 1:22 says, *“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.”* These questions are designed to help you apply today’s message in your life. We encourage you to thoughtfully answer these questions and discuss your answers with others.

1. Where are you most tempted to believe God is against you, and what would change if you treated “God is for us” as an established reality rather than a hope? (Rom. 8:31; Ps. 56:9; Heb. 13:5–6)
2. What “lesser thing” are you currently doubting God will provide, and how does the cross settle the question of His commitment to you? (Rom. 8:32; Jn. 3:16; Rom. 5:8)
3. What hardship are you interpreting as abandonment, and how would looking to the cross reinterpret that suffering through God’s proven love? (Rom. 8:32; Rom. 5:8; 1 Jn. 4:9–10)
4. What accusation (from Satan, people, or your own heart) hits you most often, and how do you answer it with God’s verdict rather than your recent performance? (Rom. 8:33; Rev. 12:10; Rom. 5:1)
5. When you sin, do you respond with condemnation (“run from God”) or conviction (“run to Christ”), and what specific confession and repentance is needed today? (Rom. 8:1; 1 Jn. 1:9; Isa. 6:6–7)
6. Where are you living as if you’re on spiritual probation, and how does justification by faith change your daily sense of acceptance before God? (Rom. 8:33; Rom. 5:1; 2 Cor. 5:21)
7. What fear about death, failure, or your future would shrink if you remembered the resurrection is God’s public confirmation that Christ’s payment was accepted? (Rom. 8:34; Rom. 4:25; Acts 2:24)
8. In what area do you feel most weak or unstable, and how does Christ’s present reign and ongoing intercession give you confidence to keep drawing near? (Rom. 8:34; Heb. 7:25; 1 Jn. 2:1)
