Application Questions

James 1:22 says, *"But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves."* These questions are designed to help you apply today's message in your life. We encourage you to thoughtfully answer these questions and discuss your answers with others.

1. Where has familiarity with Jesus replaced real faith in Jesus, causing you to treat holy things as common? (Mk 6:3-4; Jn 1:11; Heb 2:1)
2. In what area are you asking God for "more proof" while ignoring what He has already clearly said in His Word? (Mk 6:5-6; Jas 1:6-8; Heb 11:6)
3. What would it look like for you to keep obeying and ministering even after rejection or discouragement, rather than quitting or growing bitter? (Mk 6:6; Matt 10:14; 2 Tim 4:2)
4. Where are you tempted to believe God can't use you because you feel too weak, too inexperienced, or too inconsistent? (Mk 6:7; 1 Cor 1:26-29; 2 Cor 12:9-10)
5. Who has God given you for two-by-two fellowship—mutual encouragement, accountability, and shared ministry—and how will you pursue that intentionally? (Mk 6:7; Ecc 4:9-10; Heb 10:24-25)
6. What "extra baggage" (comfort, control, money, backup plans) is fueling self-reliance, and how might God be calling you to travel "lighter" in dependence on Him? (Mk 6:8-9; Prov 3:5-6; Phil 4:19)
7. Where do you need to practice contentment and faithful steadiness instead of constantly seeking an "upgrade" or a different assignment? (Mk 6:10; Heb 13:5; Phil 4:11-12)
8. What specific sin, pattern, or mindset do you need to repent of this week, and what concrete step will you take to turn toward Christ in obedient faith? (Mk 6:12; Mk 1:15; Acts 17:30)
