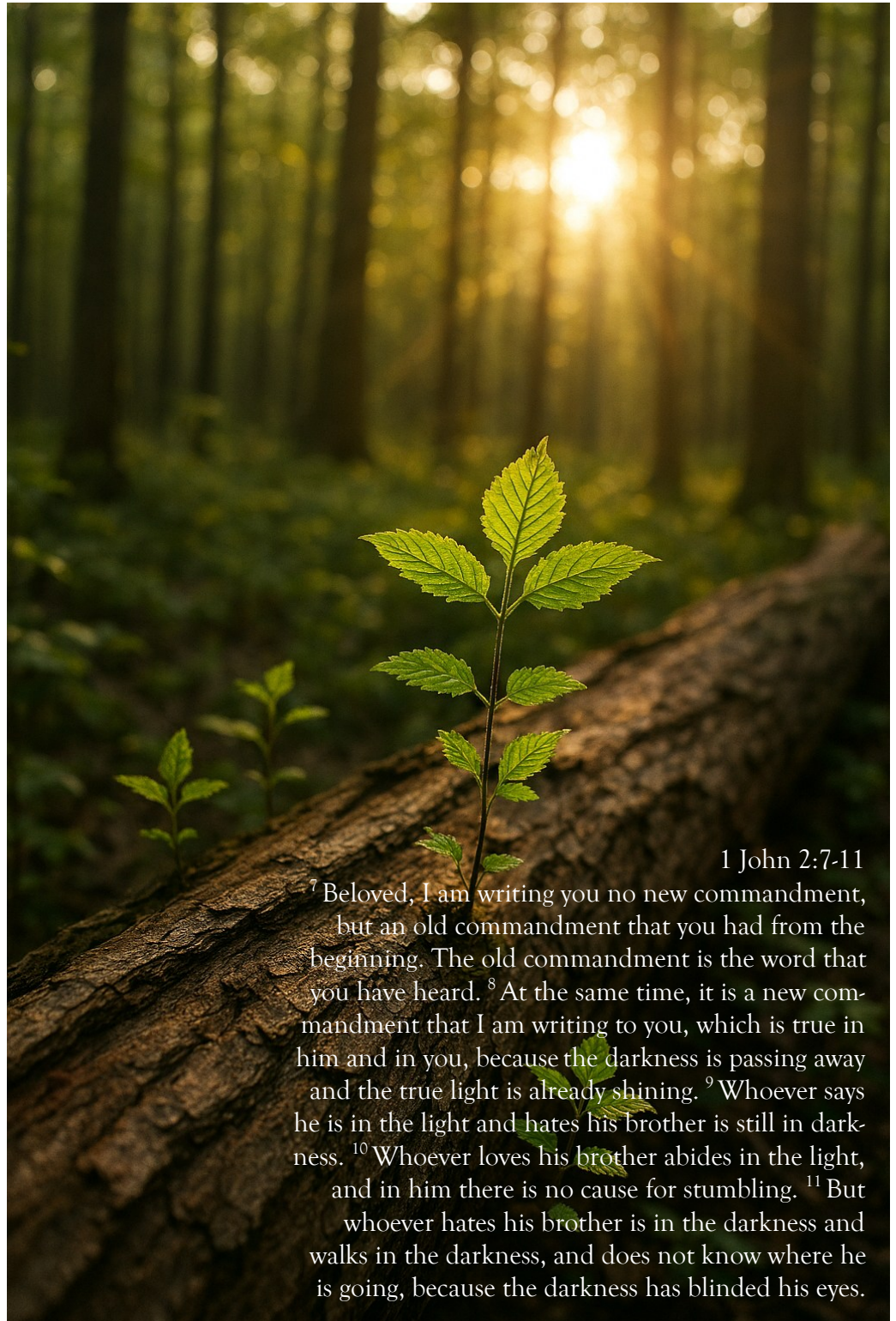

Dear Brethren and family,
Greetings from our home to yours. It's our prayer that you have a wonderful end of the year with your family and started a blessed New Year 2026. Let me share with you all wonderful news. A couple days before Rose and I returned to France, as I was coming out of Wal-Mart I noticed the fellow who checks your cashier slip. I looked at him and I could tell that he was not from the States. I asked, 'Sir where are you from?' He told me that he was from the Congo, Brazzaville a country where they speak French besides their dialect. I replied in French and his face light up with a smile. He went on explaining to me that his family situation was struggling right now. I begin telling him about God's word and immediately he was interested. I asked him to give me his home address so I could take food and at the same time we would visit his family. He called his wife right away and told her that I was coming with my wife to visit and bring food. I picked up Rose and four big boxes of food. Once we arrived his wife Jerine welcomed us. They have 3 boys and a six-month-old daughter. While visiting I asked her about their religious background. In Africa they went to an evangelical denomination. She said since they arrived they are not going anywhere, because her husband must work weekends and they had no car. I told her that if I got someone from church to pick her family up, would she come? She said yes, so brother Kamal Willian takes his family first to the building and goes back and picks up their family. Every Sunday after worship we have a Bible study with her in French through Facebook. I send a Bible correspondence in French and the same one in English so Kamal can follow. When we reached the fifth lesson, which is on baptism, she finally realized that her previous baptism was not in harmony with God's Word so Kamal took her and baptized her for the remission of her sins on December 28th. I pray that her husband will soon find a job where he would not have to work on Sundays so I can study with him also. I am keeping busy with the contacts that I made on our last trip. We are continuing to have Bible classes on Sunday

mornings with brother Mark Kee, who does an excellent job, followed by worship. Every Wednesday night is our Bible class, and Friday evening is our prayer meeting. I preach most of the time and brother Michel Gnana from India preaches as well as Mark Kee. For the singing we have brothers Franck Delormel, Christopher Gnana, Stevin Layton, and Rojami. Since we do not have a regular meeting place for the moment, about once a month we worship at sister Francoise Besse's place. Usually after worship we eat together, and everyone brings something. Since we have a website several families from various places in the world that visit Paris contact us to come to worship with us. We are always glad.

The last time we were with Francoise, we had a visitor, the son of Don Hensley former missionary in Paris. He came with his wife and he preached for us. Antoine Thran decided to be baptized but wanted to wait till I return from the states. I have not yet found a place where I could baptize him. Now in Paris you are not permitted to use a hotel swimming pool, no public swimming pool. He comes every Sunday that we meet at sister Francoises or connects on Zoom. I gave him a new BCC and will soon find a place where I can baptize him. Presently he lives 1h30 to 1h45 minutes from Sister Francoise Besse place.

Brother Francis Nicolas who lives in central part of France was supposed to have a back surgery on December 30th, but his surgeon got sick. He has been in the hospital for more than 2 months now. Sister Sophia will undergo 4 surgeries following her accident; the first one will take place on the 2nd of February. Rose is doing better and still on meds. Brother Franck Delormel with his diabetes, is causing him eye problems and, every two weeks they give shots in his eyes. Lillian his mother has what will call Charcot sickness and does not have much time to live. Please keep them in your prayers.

We are indeed grateful unto God and to all of you who are still involved and continuing to support us for all these years. May our God richly bless you in 2026.
