A helpless, lost, or stranded person cannot be rescued in "theory." No document, law, or weighty tradition can pull a drowning person from the water. Someone must throw a rope or dive in! Policies and procedures are important, but someone in distress needs a Savior!

What's the Problem?

The need for a Savior seems self-evident considering the human condition. Salvation assumes an _____ (danger, disease, doom, death, bondage, oppression, trouble), in essence, consequences of _____. Yet many folks refuse and reject God's Savior out of stubborn **pride**. Other religions are actually deceptive regarding this. Judaism (for example) uses the OT to teach that salvation is physical and social deliverance [the exodus from Egypt] and seeks to rely on moral credit and God's grace and mercy. But there is a missing ingredient!

How does God get to mercy unless he ignores justice? What kind of God would ignore justice? Certainly not a righteous God! There is in the Jewish religion no

substitute for mankind, no personal Savior. This is not simply a dilemma, but a flaw!
For them, the Messiah is a social/military deliverer, but he is not a savior from sin.
