1. What's one takeaway from last weekend's sermon?
2. What stands out to you in John's vision of the great multitude? Compare this description with Revelation 5:1-14.
3. Why is it significant that the innumerable multitude includes people from "every nation, tribe, people, and language?" How does this relate to Matthew 24:14? Why is it essential that we target the unreached peoples of the world?
4. What does this image reveal about God's heart for the nations? How does this vision challenge or inspire your view of global missions?
5. How does this passage relate to the famous quote from John Piper: "Missions exists because worship doesn't." What do you think this means?
6. How should this future vision shape our current understanding of global tensions and God's ultimate aim of reaching the nations with the gospel? In what ways should this affect how we use our time, resources, and gifts today?
7. The multitude in Revelation 7:9-10 is diverse yet unified in worshiping the Lamb. How can our church reflect this diversity in our worship and community life today? What practical steps can we take to embrace people from different cultures and backgrounds? What does this passage say about the value of cultural and ethnic diversity in God's kingdom? How can we live this out now?
8. Who is one ethnic group, neighbor, or nation you could pray for or reach out to this week?
9. What steps can you take to become more intentionally involved in reaching the nations in our community, and around the world?
10. How does the certainty of this future scene in Revelation 7:9-10 provide hope for those involved in missions work? How can this vision encourage us when we face discouragement or challenges in sharing the gospel?
11. Read Revelation 7:9-17 slowly and reverently. Conclude by praying, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb! God, we pray, use us for the spread of the gospel to every nation, tribe, tongue, and people, and use me by going or sending others who will go."
