

# Sealed and Saved Discussion Questions

Revelation 7:1-17

1. The Babylon Bee joked about "watching Revelation happen outside." What current events have made you think about Bible prophecy recently?
2. The sermon described three aspects of God's seal on believers — possession, protection, and preservation. Which of these means the most to you personally right now, and why?
3. Satan counterfeits God's seal with his own mark. Where do you see people today finding their identity and "ownership" in things other than Christ?
4. The unusual list of the 144,000 shows God has a specific, sovereign plan. How does it encourage you to know that God has "accounted for every single one"?
5. Heaven will be multiethnic, multilingual, and multinational. How well does your current circle of relationships reflect that vision? What's one step you could take to broaden it?
6. According to verse 15, what will these people be doing in Heaven? Will this be pleasant or drudgery? Why?
7. The Lord cleans, calls, comes, cares, and comforts. Which one do you most need to lean into in your current season of life?
8. Verse 17 says God will wipe away every tear. What tears are you carrying right now that you need to bring before the Shepherd? What is the meaning behind someone wiping away your tears? How does God wipe away our tears?
9. The Lamb is also the Shepherd because the one who was sacrificed is the one who now guides. What does that dual image tell you about the character of Jesus?
10. The sermon challenged us to pray specifically for Jewish evangelism and the peace of Jerusalem. Have you ever prayed regularly for Israel? What would it look like to add that to your prayer life?
11. Is there someone attending Edgewood from a different cultural or ethnic background that you could intentionally reach out to this week?
12. The sermon closed with the story of the tribesman who said, "God must have been thinking about us long before we knew about Him." How does that story stir your heart for unreached peoples?
13. The final question of the sermon was: Will you be standing with the sealed and the saved? For someone you know who hasn't made that decision, what would you say to them?
