

Breaking Down Walls Discussion Questions

Ephesians 2:11-22

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February 3-4, 2024

1. What does it mean to be “alienated?” How have we been alienated in the past?
2. How should remembering something change our behavior? Why is this important when we remember things that Bible says?
3. Why did Paul address the issue between the Jews and Gentiles? How does Paul’s wisdom apply to us today with racial differences? Do you have some trace of racism in your heart? How can you remove it and work on this issue?
4. Why is it important that Christ reconciles all of us who believe? Since Christ has reconciled people of other nationalities, shouldn’t we make peace with others as well? Why or why not?
5. How did Christ’s death break down barriers?
6. How are we all one in Christ?
7. Why is it a privilege to have full access to God through Christ? What does this mean for us? How is this different than the way it was in the Old Testament?
8. What does it mean to be a citizen? How do you feel towards other people who are citizens of the same country? How does this apply to being citizens of Heaven?
9. What do you do for family members that you don’t or won’t do for just anyone? How does being a part of God’s family affect the way you treat or respond to fellow believers even if you have never met?
10. How do we fit together in the body of Christ? What job does God have for you to do? What happens if you don’t do the job?
11. What are we supposed to do to “maintain the unity of the Spirit?”
12. Read 1 Corinthians 6:19, 3:16. What does it mean that “your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit?” How does this affect the way you behave and what you say and do?
13. What is your commitment to the local church like? Is there something you need to do to improve your commitment?
14. Do you have a relationship with Jesus Christ? How do you know you do?
