1. What learning or lesson have you drawn from the sermon this past weekend? Share one new insight or something God reminded you of.
2. Discuss how Satan uses tactics similar to the Saharan Sand Viper. How have you experienced a Satanic ambush?
3. Ponder this statement, "You got this. You're a strong person. Believe in yourself." How can you transition from this syrupy sentiment to a gospel conversation with an unbeliever? Read 2 Corinthians 12:9-10. What are some ways you've experienced the Lord giving you strength when you felt weak?
4. Which of our three spiritual enemies (the world, the flesh, and the devil), gives you the most trouble? Describe a time when you were attacked on all three fronts. How did you handle it?
5. What are some things that would change in your life if you focused more on the Christian life as a battleground than a playground?
6. Why is it important to be prepared and protected in the realm of spiritual warfare? Describe what can happen if we are passive or oblivious to Satan's tactics?
7. Discuss this quote from Abraham Lincoln: "Be sure you put your feet in the right place, and stand firm." How does this apply to your spiritual life?
8. Read James 4:7. Why is it important to submit to God before trying to resist the devil? What promise does God make in this verse?
9. Look up the four times we're told to stand in Ephesians 6:10-14. Why is it essential to hold our ground and not flee? How do we resist the devil and not run from him? Why is it important to run from the occult world?
10. The sermon listed 12 schemes of Satan. What strategy do you think Satan uses the most in our culture today? Which one are you the most vulnerable to? Why?
11. Read 1 John 4:4. How does this verse help us do battle against the evil one? What are some ways we can incorporate this truth into our prayers?
12. What will you put into practice after hearing the sermon? Who will hold you accountable?
13. Read Ephesians 6:10-20 out loud and then turn this passage into a time of prayer.
