

The Witness of the Witnesses Discussion Questions

Revelation 11:1-19

1. What is something people commonly use to measure success today? Why do you think our culture is so obsessed with measurements?
2. Read Revelation 11:3-6. What characteristic of the two witnesses stands out to you? What can we learn from their courage and faithfulness?
3. The witnesses were clothed in sackcloth, symbolizing humility, repentance, and mourning. How does their appearance contrast with the message we sometimes send to those who are unsaved?
4. Read Revelation 11:7-10. What does the phrase “when they have finished their testimony” teach us about God’s sovereignty over our lives and ministries?
5. Why do you think the world celebrated the death of the two witnesses? In what ways do you see resistance to God’s truth in our culture today?
6. Read Revelation 11:15-18. How does the announcement that Christ's kingdom will reign forever encourage believers facing uncertainty or suffering?
7. The sermon stated: “God measures what matters to Him.” What are some ways you are tempted to measure your worth or success apart from God's standards?
8. Read Psalm 139:23-24. What is God revealing or refining in your life right now?
9. Who has been a faithful witness of Christ in your life? What made their testimony so impactful?
10. Is there a person in your family, workplace, neighborhood, or circle of friends who needs to hear about Christ? How can you intentionally reach out to them this week?
11. The sermon concluded with Romans 3:23 and the reminder that none of us measure up to God's standard. Why is it important to understand this before we can appreciate the gospel?
12. Discuss this statement: “The One who measured up was treated as though He didn’t, so that those who don't measure up could be treated as though they do.” How does this capture the heart of the gospel?
13. What does it mean personally for you that God doesn’t measure believers by their record, but by the righteousness of Jesus Christ?
14. What will you put into practice this week from the sermon?
