Isaiah 6:1-8

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August 1-2, 2026

1. How have you lived your life differently since coming to know God?
2. What does complacent mean? In what ways have you become complacent in your worship of God?
3. Are there areas of your life or in your family where sin is creeping slowly in? What are some examples of how sin slowly creeps into our lives?
4. What parts of our worship services can become more of a ritual? How do we keep our worship live and active and not just going through rituals?
5. What event or situation in your life totally rocked and shook your world? Why did this affect you so?
6. Who or what do you depend on? What happens when that person or thing is no longer available? How do we make sure that we are depending on God, not our jobs, money, health etc.?
7. How can a person “fear” someone and still feel like that person is approachable, that you can talk to them and ask for things? What makes the difference?
8. What does it mean for God to be sovereign ruler of your life? Does God truly have this position in your life? Why or why not? Is this a once and done decision or is it a daily decision? Why?
9. What is humility? Do you show humility before God?
10. Are you willing to go and do whatever God asks of you? Why or why not? What fear do you have about what God may ask you to do?
11. Do you seek God’s presence daily? What does this look like?
12. Read Isaiah 6:1-4. As you picture this scene, what do you experience and feel? How do you feel about yourself before a holy God?
13. What sin do you need to confess and receive forgiveness for?
14. How do our words reveal what is truly in our hearts?
15. How do you measure your sin? Do you compare yourself to other Christians? Do you say I am not as bad as that person? Or do you measure yourself against God’s holy standard? Are you dealing with your sin the way God wants you to? Why or why not?
16. Are you willing to answer the call of God to go the way Isaiah was? Why or why not?

17. How are you using your talents and spiritual gifts for God's kingdom work?
18. Do you believe that there is anything too hard for God? Why or why not? How do our actions show what we believe about this question?
19. In what ways do we limit the work God can do in our lives and through us?
