"Today, all you need to get world-class knowledge is motivation and an Internet connection. The next step is to make all knowledge credible, regardless of how or where it was obtained. As long as you've learned something, you can now demonstrate it with credibility through Accredible," says Danny King, co-founder of Accredible.

On [Accredible.com](http://www.accredible.com), the world's curious can find everything they need to learn online. Users can search thousands of courses to discover new things to learn, add courses to a "to-learn" list, and get reminders for upcoming courses. While a course is in progress, users can stay organized by uploading assignments and other course materials. Social features allow users to connect around shared interests, work collaboratively and see what courses their friends are taking. As users continue their lifelong learning, they can build their virtual certificate wall and showcase their knowledge and skills. Once a course is completed, Accredible's flexible portfolio credential format makes it simple to embed evidence of learning on a LinkedIn profile, personal website, or paper resume.
