**Lupe Berretta** is an Improvement Advisor at Grady Health System and a U.S. Army Veteran with over a decade of experience driving healthcare transformation across clinical, operational, and government settings. In previous roles, she advanced women's health initiatives for more than 20 hospitals across Georgia, including standing up the inaugural Maternal Health Equity Task Force to address challenges to reproductive healthcare access. She also developed system-wide strategies to navigate

rapidly changing women's health legislation, track disparities in maternal health outcomes, and advocate for equitable access to care. Her leadership includes spearheading a maternal mortality and morbidity dashboard to propose data-driven interventions, coordinate provider education, and provide strategic community engagement opportunities. These initiatives have contributed to measurable improvements in healthcare quality and outcomes, significant cost savings, and multiple awards recognizing her impact.

Lupe holds a Master of Healthcare Administration from Colorado State University with a concentration in Organizational Leadership and Change Management, is a certified Lean Six Sigma Black Belt, and holds a project management certification. She is pursuing her Doctorate of Public Health (DrPH) at GSU to strengthen her ability to bridge healthcare systems with the communities they serve.
