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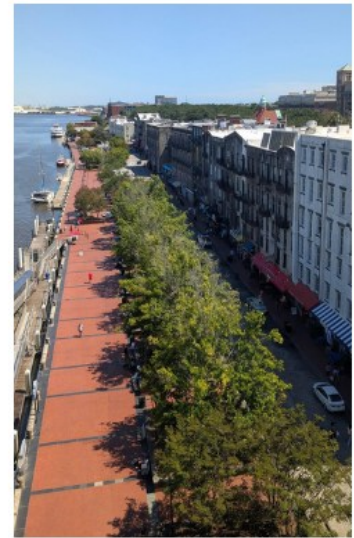

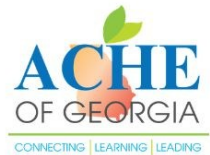

Three years goes by fast. In 2023, I stepped into this role with enormous respect for what ACHE of Georgia represents and a genuine desire to make a difference for our members across Georgia. 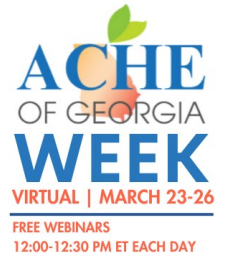

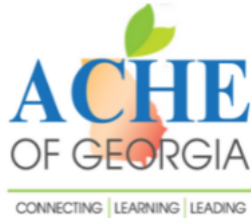
