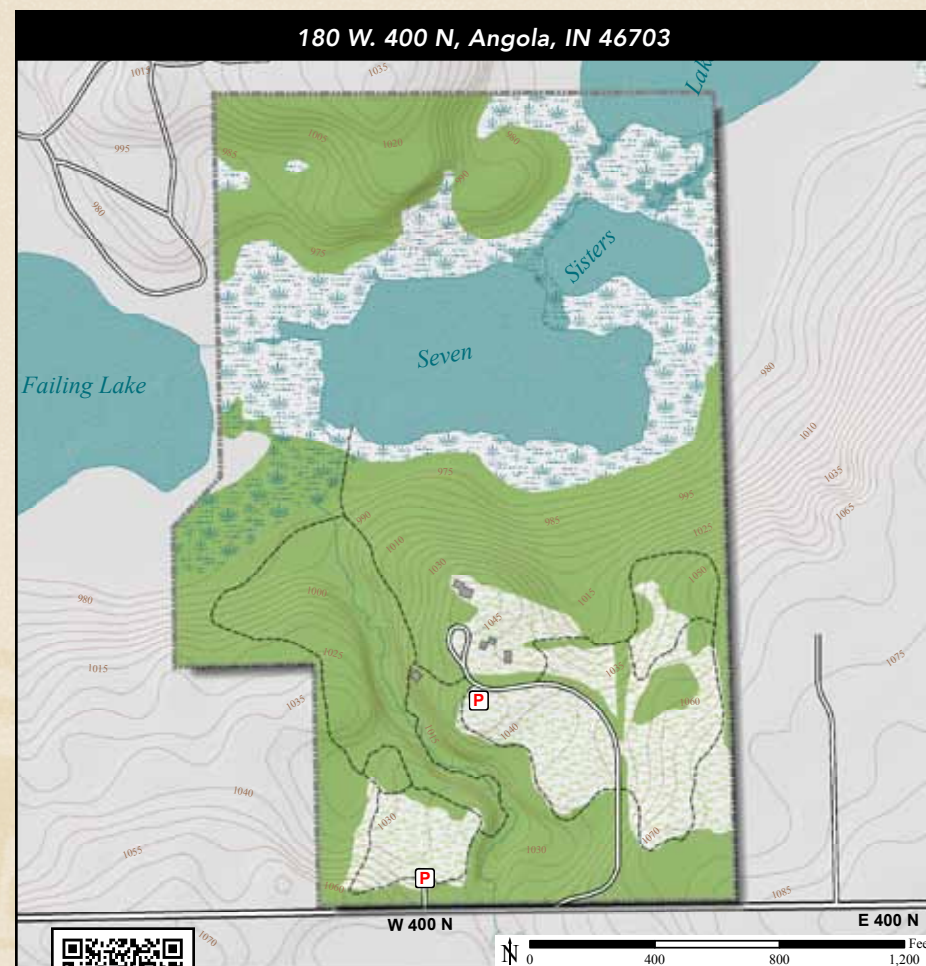




ACREAGE: 254.8 | YEAR ACQUIRED: 1983, 1984, 1998, 1999



*Glacially carved kettle-hole lakes are bordered by a wetland fen system. In secluded areas, sandhill cranes have established nests.*

*There are rolling meadows and surrounding uplands covered in an oak, hickory and red maple forest. In spring, a profusion of wildflowers, including white trillium, carpet deep ravines near hundred-year-old log buildings—one now used for ACRES events, and another as the caretaker's residence.*



**DIRECTIONS:**

From Angola take SR 127 (Wayne St.) north 4.6 miles to 400 N and turn right (east). Travel 0.4 miles to the preserve on the left.
