Here's our latest monthly (weekly, bimonthly) tip for you from the Office of Goodguys and We care.

There is a scam out there specifically targeting senior veterans of any war. They set up an "educational" seminar for one purpose and that is to sell you annuities. They do this by telling you that if you buy these annuities, you can qualify for free veterans' benefits under the V.A. program, Aid and Attendance which provides a monthly income.

The truth is that the V.A. program is for low income veterans with few assets. Wealthy people do not qualify and should never think they can qualify if they reposition their assets into an irrevocable trust so that they will look poor enough to get these benefits. The scheme the salespeople are trying to put over on older vets is to get your money in their hands. They get big sales commissions and finder's fees for getting you to buy.

Don't fall for this! If you want to know about any Veterans' Administration benefits you can find yourself out by checking the VA website at http://www.benefits.va.gov/pension/aid_attendance_housebound.asp or asking a friend or family member to check it out for you. Information about VA benefits, including Aid and Attendance is always free. Please don't be fooled into tying up your hard earned money for years in an annuity where you can't get it all if you need it unless you pay very stiff penalties. It is not suitable for an aging person to buy annuities such as these schemers are trying to manipulate you into buying.
