

The General Ronald R. Fogleman Award

The General Ronald R. Fogleman Award was instituted this year [2008] to recognize the top Advanced Studies of Air Mobility (ASAM) graduate. ASAM is an Air Force-sponsored Intermediate Developmental Education program taught at the USAF EC, specifically a 13 month graduate degree program delivered in partnership with the Air Force Institute of Technology (AFIT). 16 officers are selected to attend, each receiving a Master's Degree in Logistics and Air Mobility upon completion. Each student must also complete an intensive graduate research project (GRP) sponsored by a senior officer that often has major impact on mobility operations. The actual description of the award at graduation is as follows:

"THE GENERAL RONALD R. FOGLEMAN AWARD RECOGNIZES EXCELLENCE ACROSS A BROAD RANGE OF CRITERIA, INCLUDING PEER REVIEW, LEADERSHIP, WRITTEN AND ORAL PRESENTATION OF RESEARCH, ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE, AND PHYSICAL FITNESS."

The specific weighting of criteria used to determine the recipient of the Fogleman Award is as follows:

Academic Performance: GPA - 40%

Graduate Research Project (GRP) written and oral presentation - 25%

Commander's Assessment - 15%

Peer Assessment of Class Contribution - 10%

Fitness - 10%.
