Restricted Alcohol Policy

Silver Bay YMCA has a restricted alcohol policy throughout its property. Listed below are the restrictions and expectations of all guests and members:

- Alcohol may be consumed within one's lodging room/cottage BUT must be limited to the alcohol types described below AND is limited to the registered guests of that room/cottage AND provided that stated quiet hours (11pm-7am) are adhered to. In room "parties" are NOT permitted.
- All conditions of the New York State Alcoholic Beverage Control Law must be properly followed. Individuals under 21 years of age will not serve or be served alcoholic beverages, nor be given or possess alcoholic beverages. The registered guest(s) is responsible for any underage drinking and assumes ALL liability.
- The only alcoholic beverages permitted are beer, champagne, hard cider and wine. Kegs are prohibited. Any other alcoholic beverages are prohibited and may not be served or consumed.
- Transportation of allowed alcohol products to/from lodging must be done discreetly as not to offend other guests who may struggle with alcohol addiction or for religious and/or other reasons, be alcohol adverse.
- Alcohol is NEVER permitted in public areas including, but not limited to, lobby areas, walkways, beach areas, fire pits, public porches NOR can it be consumed in any unauthorized areas. Due to its ministry focus, alcohol is NOT PERMITTED at any time at Brookside Community House and Trinity House.
- Any individual who appears or acts intoxicated or who is under the influence of alcohol to the point of engaging in disrespectful or unruly behavior is NOT permitted.
- There is ZERO TOLERANCE concerning the Alcohol Policy. If this policy is violated by any guest/member, Silver Bay YMCA reserves the right to dismiss or cause to be removed, any individual from the grounds without any reimbursement or compensation and with or without warning.
- Any organization or group must request and be granted written authorization from Silver Bay YMCA before alcohol may be served on campus as part of any event.
- The registered guest(s) shall not offer nor serve Silver Bay YMCA employees alcoholic beverages unless the employee has obtained prior permission from the CEO to attend an approved contracted special event (e.g. wedding; anniversary, etc.).
- Silver Bay YMCA reserves the right to amend or suspend this policy with or without notice at any time.
