JESUS CHRIST - MAN'S HOPE #3

God's Grace to Man

John, the apostle, by inspiration wrote, "For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ" (John 1:17). Jesus was certainly the deliverer of God's wonderful message of truth to man (Hebrews 1:1-3). Jesus, by His sacrifice and teaching, extended God's great grace to man (Titus 2:11-15). Man that comes into Jesus Christ can move from falling deeper and deeper in the destruction of sin to progressing in the grace of God. One should note that each of the following aspects of grace are found only in Jesus Christ. Therefore, these things can only be accessed when one comes into Christ by being baptized (Galatians 3:26, 27).

Man is saved by grace in Jesus Christ. After describing the fact that man is saved by God's grace through Christ (Ephesians 2:7), Paul states that man is saved by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8). Salvation by grace through faith in Christ begins one in the progression of God's grace. Salvation is found in Christ because the forgiveness of sins according to the riches of God's grace is found in Christ (Ephesians 1:7).

Man is able to grow in grace and knowledge in Jesus Christ. Peter wrote, "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus

Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). Jesus expects those who are his to be growing individuals. The Christian is to be a student of the word which will allow him to grow in those things which God gives and in the knowledge of the things of God.

Man is able to abound in grace in Jesus Christ. Romans 5:20, 21 says, "Moreover the law entered, that the offence might abound. But where sin abounded, grace did much more abound: That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord." In the Old Testament there was not sufficient sacrifice to take away sin (Hebrews 10:1-3). God's grace abounds in the New Covenant through Jesus Christ to take away man's sin.

Man is provided sufficient grace to overcome in Christ. When the apostle Paul talked to God about his infirmities, God said, "My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9). Paul was being told that God's grace made full provision for Paul and that it would give him the strength to overcome his physical ailments. Paul later encouraged Timothy to "be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 2:1).

Man can receive a multiplied grace and peace in the knowledge of Jesus Christ. "Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord. . ." (2 Peter 1:3). In Christ is the only place true grace and peace can be found. The fulness of grace and peace are found in Christ.

Man needs God's grace because man sins. Isaiah 59:1, 2 says, "Behold, the LORD'S hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that it cannot hear: But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you, that he will not hear." The purpose of Christ was to bring God's grace into the world and provide salvation for man. The prophecies concerning Christ noted this very important point. Matthew 1:21 prophesied, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins." All men need the grace which is found in Christ because all men have sinned (Romans 3:23). God, in Christ, made provision for man to be brought out of spiritual death into spiritual life. It is therefore by the righteousness of Christ that sinful man can be made righteous.

Man sometimes becomes satisfied with his own sin and refuses to leave it. Man who remains in sin gets deeper and deeper in his own sins. Generally man digresses deeper and deeper into sin. The psalmist indicated that man might first walk in sin, then stand in sin, and finally will completely sit down satisfied in the sin (Psalm 1:1). Man cannot make his own way out of sin, but must depend upon the grace of Jesus Christ. One should evaluate their obedience to God to ascertain if

they are in the grace of Christ or if they are sinking deeper and deeper into sin.
