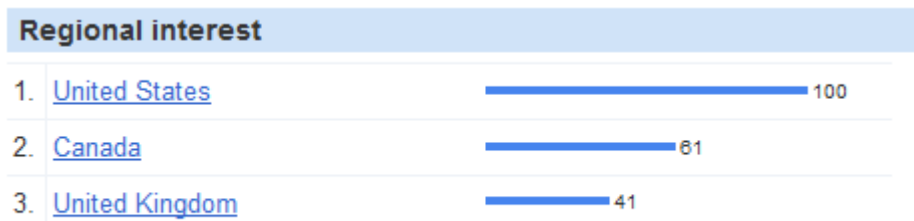
Web Search Interest in 1 Year (2010-2011)

Shows general market interest online according to geographical location

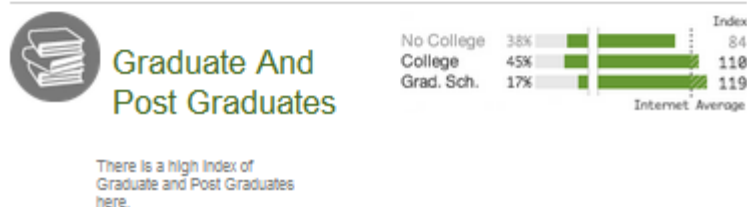
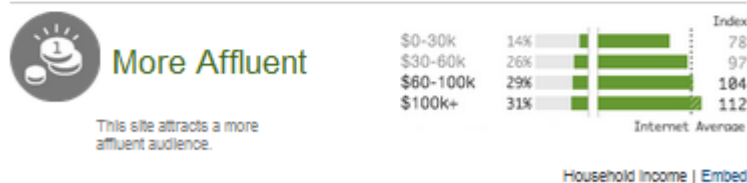
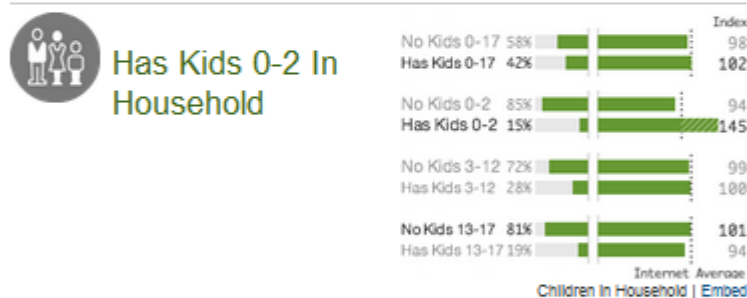
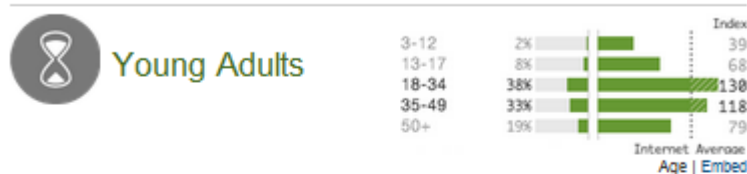

Demographics (data based on www.marriage.about.com)

Demographics are the characteristics of a population. In the field of marketing, it is important to define the demographic profile of your target audience. This is to identify target audience in the overall population and to create a clear and complete picture of the characteristics of the target consumer.

The above data tells you the gender, age, children per household, education status, income levels, and other demographic insights of your target audience.

The “index” represents the delivery of a specific audience segment compared to the internet average of 100. Composition, which is represented by the % of audience figure on the left side of the chart, represents the percentage of a property’s total audience that meets a specific demographic criteria.

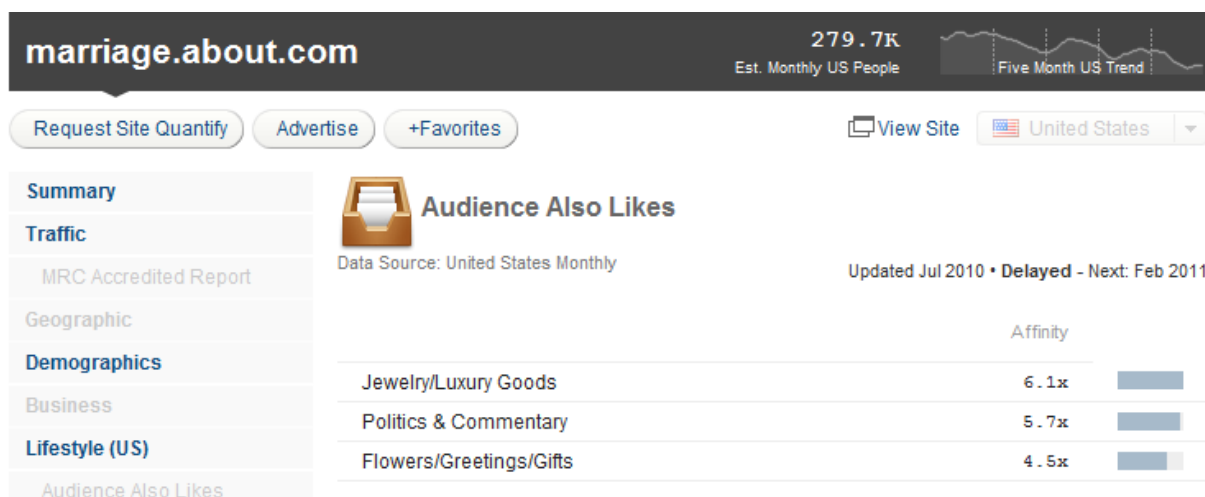
For example, an index of 100 indicates the target audience is equivalent to the demographic make-up of the total internet population. Any increase over 100 means that the property is “over indexed” and attracts a more concentrated group of a particular demographic group than in the general internet population.

Psychographics (data based on www.marriage.about.com)

In the field of marketing, psychographic variables are any attributes relating to personality, values, attitudes, interests, or lifestyles.

The following data profile shows other topics that the audience is likely to be interested to visit and the affinity indicates how much more likely than average.

An affinity of 10x means that your target audience is ten times likelier to be interested in the topics than the average internet user.

Problems & Frustrations

- **Silent treatment**

So my husband and I have been married for 8 months (together for 3years) and he has been giving me the silent treatment for the past 10 days. We both need to work on this; however, his coping mechanism is to shut down completely and give me the silent treatment. After a couple of days of the nonverbal stuff, I try to talk to him but I typically don't get a response.

- **Exclusion from social activities**

I have been married for 30 years, throughout this time my husband has preferred a separate social life. He excludes me from his social activities. I have a good social life I've made new friends through sport and the internet but what I haven't got is couple friends which most people of my age seem to have, because he has his social circle and I have mine.

- **Poor communication and failure to recognize signals of unhappiness**

We have been married for 21 years and have 2 children aged 12 & 17. My sons have special needs. After Christmas my wife told me that she couldn't cope anymore and that she had been pretending everything had been ok for years. The failing has been a lack of attention and interest in ourselves. I have been a poor communicator and not read my wife's signs of unhappiness. Added to this my wife has to lay on my sons bed each night until he is asleep this has done nothing for our relationship

- **Change of heart and in attitude**

After being together for almost 8 years myself and my hubby got married in July this year, but practically straight afterwards the cracks started appearing. Hubby appeared distant a lot of the time, cold and just not the man I used to know, he went through a rough patch at work and I put it down to it being this that caused the issues. Then in September I looked through his mobile bill and emails and found that there had been something going off between him and a girl from work.

- **Financial difficulties and a failing marriage**

I am in a marriage that is failing. I know that it is my fault that we are having financial difficulties but I am doing my best to make our business succeed. I make money and she goes through it. I can never make enough to keep her happy.

- **Hard time communicating**

I am recently married, 9 months, and I have a hard time talking to my husband sometimes. I think it may be because he keeps in contact with some of his ex's and I am uncomfortable with that.

- **Racial differences**

Things went wrong after we got married. We're in an inter-racial marriage and recently the differences between our family backgrounds, races and cultures have become increasingly obvious. We can't seem to agree on anything anymore.

- **Emotional affair**

Been happily married for 17 years, had a good life have one child. My wife is 11 years younger than me. She has been suffering with depression for the last 18 months. Recently I noticed a real change in her behaviour at home and after a few weeks I questioned this. I was totally devastated when she told me that she had become emotionally involved with someone at work, (emotional affair).

- **Loss of trust**

Four weeks ago I discovered that my 43 year old husband was having an 'affair' with his 29 year old boss. I use the term 'affair' loosely because he assures me that they never slept together and that they only kissed. I'm not sure whether I believe this or whether he's just saying it to make me feel better. All these have passed and he has moved on very quickly and is annoyed that I can't do the same. If he never had to see her again I would have found all this a lot easier, but they email and talk most days and although he shows me all his emails I am still finding it hard to believe what he tells me. I need some advice on how to move forward with this. I want to trust him again but it's not going to be as easy for me as he seems to think it should be.

I took her profile to my parents and they bluntly refused saying she is of a different race and that our family backgrounds do not match. My parents have been doing bride search for me for quite some time now but nothing materialized so far.

- **Issues with family over marriage arrangement**

I have a friend, her parents want her to marry a man that she doesn't love which I find terrible. They said that they'd disown her if she doesn't marry him. She wants to say no but can't towards her parents. How do I help her to face her fears? Or help her in any way?

- **Marriage affected due to illness**

My husband was diagnosed with ADHD about 2 years ago, he is 39. He has every symptom of it, but cannot seem to find the right meds plus counseling. Our marriage really takes a hit from it

- **Marriage plans affected by family disapproval**

I am in love with a guy who doesn't stay in my country.. after a long struggle, we convinced our parents to let us marry. Just as we are about to settle the wedding plans, his parents have stopped him from coming to visit me. We are very upset now.... What should we do?

- **Marriage breaks down just before the birth of child**

My husband and I had great understanding when we got married. but over a period of just 6 months he [and sometimes me too] started behaving very rudely and irrationally to each other. During that period i got pregnant and the problems between us grew more. I moved to my parents' house and it is almost a year, I'm here. Our baby is born and my marriage is at the edge of divorce.
