The third and final High-Power match was held on the first Saturday of September. We had a decent turn out considering competing matches were being held at Cadillac Sportsman's Club and Alliance Rifle Club in Malvern Ohio. I want to thank those that shot the EIC here on Saturday and then travelled to the other matches to compete on Sunday.

The year went well. We used the etargets for all of our matches, including the Vintage Rifle match. This really sped up running the

match, all matches completed firing by 2:30 in the afternoon. Clean up took another hour so we were typically able to release the range around 3:30. This is a big change from the times when we pulling targets in the pits, changing target faces and running pit changes between relays. The e-targets also enable shorter matches by using the whole line and running two relays. Right now, depending on the match format, we can host a maximum of 28 competitors in two relays Depending on the match format, going to three relays adds an hour to running the match. In the off season I will be doing diagnostics on the e-target system looking for opportunities to improve the system. I will also be looking into more efficient wayst to process the match data and automate the results so that I can publish them

On our property you may run into deer, red foxes, turkeys, hawks of multiple species, eagles, and one of my favorite birds, the Great Horned Owl.
