This \$2,000 renewable fellowship was created through a donation from the Jane Howell family. Jane was a lifelong middle-school educator and past president of WMC who valued high-quality mathematics education. Both traditional students and people pursuing teacher licensure through alternate pathways (including current paraprofessionals) are encouraged to apply.



Jane was instrumental in the establishment of the Wisconsin Mathematics Education Foundation (WMEF) and served on the Board of Directors for the first seven years of the foundation's existence.

Jane Howell Fellowship Materials*

- A. Submit a PDF of an unofficial transcript of grades and evidence of enrollment in a program that would, upon completion, provide you with a Wisconsin State Teaching License that would allow you to teach mathematics in a K-12 setting in the state of Wisconsin.
- B. Submit a PDF of your written statement as a response to the following questions. Be sure to respond to each question completely. Your statement should be no more than two pages total using no smaller than 12-point Arial font.
 - a. How have your life experiences developed your passion for mathematics?
 - b. How will you support students from a variety of backgrounds so that they are successful learners?
 - c. How do you envision instilling a love of mathematics in your students?
 - d. Delineate your licensure plan, math/math education courses, and an approximate timeline for completion.
- C. Submit a PDF of an official letter of support. The letter should be between 300 to 500 words from someone who has witnessed your passion for mathematics. You may submit the letter with your materials or ask the author to submit the PDF to the email address above. In this letter, please ask the author to address the following topics:
 - a. A statement of the experience the writer has had with the student.
 - b. Supporting evidence of the applicant's interest in teaching.
 - c. Supporting evidence of the applicant's passion for mathematics.

*Complete all submissions using 12-point Arial or similar font.

This is not designed to be a competitive scholarship. Fellowship recipients are encouraged to reapply every year, up to a maximum of four awards per individual.
