Ms. Spear:

lowa is a non-fee schedule state; therefore, there are no regulatory "State" requirements. The Rule in lowa is that if the employer/insurance carrier directed the claimant to the health care provider, then they accept and approve the health care provider's charges and have to pay 100% of the charges for the work comp injury. Employers/Insurance Carriers must pay for all "reasonable and necessary" medical care, not what they claim is "usual and customary."

Attached is a copy of Iowa Code 85.27 that pertains to medical services, charges, and payments. As you can see, the provisions of this statute govern what services are to be covered pursuant to Workers' Compensation laws in the State of Iowa. The key words are "reasonable" and "necessary." There are no specific standards or guidelines defining the word "reasonable." Similarly, Iowa Workers' Compensation law does not outline a fee schedule, nor legislate URC standards.

In addition, attached is a copy of Rule 876-10 concerning health service dispute resolutions. Rule 876-10.3 outlines the necessary steps that need to be taken before a medical fee dispute can be submitted to the Agency. Please note, a

health service dispute resolution is to be initiated by the "responsible party," i.e. the party (insurance carrier) paying the medical bill.
