Reflection:

"I LOVE MY CHURCH"

(Scripture: 1 Corinthians 12: 4 – 11; 15:58; 1 Peter 4: 8 - 11)

There are people gathered here this morning who love Applewood United Church. As an expression of that love you make a conscious effort on a daily, a few times a week, once a week to express your love for this community of faith inspired by Jesus with your attendance at services and meetings, your prayers, your service, your financial support and conversation in the larger community.

Applewood United requires your active participation in order to be a vibrant community of Jesus' followers effectively carrying out its ministry and mission.

What's in it for you? Philosopher William James said, "The best use of life is to spend it for something that outlasts it." The truth is only the Kingdom of God is going to last. Everything else will vanish.

Therefore there is good reason to live meaning-filled lives – lives committed to God through worship, missions, focused use of our resources, spiritual growth, fellowship with Christians, care for neighbour and all of creation.

The results of these activities will last forever.

We were put on earth to make a contribution. We weren't created just to consume resources—to eat, breathe, take up space and create more consumers.

God designed all of us with a purpose in mind. A primary purpose of ours is to love God and express that love in worshipping, praising God. Isaiah 43: 21 reads, "The people I have shaped for myself will broadcast my praises."

Another way in which we live out our love for God is by loving our neighbour and expressing that love in serving God by serving others. The Bible says, "We are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works." (Ephesians 2: 10)

Many best-selling books offer advice on how to "get" the most out of life. That's not the reason God made you. You were created to add to life on earth, not just take from it. God wants you to give something back. God not only creates us to serve but equips us to serve.

Each of us has a particular role to play based on the way we were shaped by God. Each of us was uniquely designed or shaped to do certain things. We are not an assembly-line product but custom-designed.

Peter and Paul both emphasize that all of us have been given special gifts and all of us are called to serve using the given gifts. 1 Peter 4: 10 reads, "Serve one another with whatever gift each of you have received."

In 1 Corinthians 12 Paul lists a variety of gift that have been distributed by the Spirit of God to people. Verse 7 says the "gifts have been given for the common good."

Father Thomas Ryan writes, "The Christian is one who lives with others, and who never monopolizes any good thing, whether material or spiritual for his or her own benefit. The Christian is a bearer of an active concern that each one has access to a life that is always fuller, on earth no less than heaven."

Gifted people in the church are known not for how much better they are at something but for how much good they do using the gift(s) they have.

Together we are the body of Christ, the Church, and we have been gifted to carry on Jesus Christ's earthly ministry.

It is never a lack of gifts that troubles the church today, but rather a lack of commitment and readiness for us to be used by God.

Let us choose this day to be fully committed to God and one another by "serving one another with whatever gift or gifts each of us has been given."
