Three: We pray for people who are sick and in hospital, or sick and staying in their homes.

We pray for anyone who is suffering with mental illness, or people who are waiting for tests and treatments. We pray for everyone who is infected and fighting COVID-19 today, and for the families that love them.

One: Help us to learn how best to be your church, to share your love and do your justice, God.

Two: Keep us praying, God, and keep us growing in faith and following your way through our actions and our choices.

Three: Hear our prayers, God –and through Jesus our Light, the Spirit our quide, and in your love, answer them.
