The Optometric Flyfishers, founded in 1991 by POA members Mark Boas and Charlie Griffen, are excited to announce EyeFlyFish 2016, September 8-11. This year's attendees will be treated to some of the finest trout fishing anywhere. While enjoying the hospitality of the Edgewater Inn, a beautiful inn rich in history (the original farmhouse dates to 1762 and belonged to the grandson of William Penn), guided fly-fishing will be on the Little Juniata River in South Central Pennsylvania. The "Little J" is a Class 1 wild brown trout fishery and a world-class fly-fishing destination.



This year's event will kickoff with a welcome reception and presentation by master fly tier, and author, Henry Ramsay. Henry's book, "Matching Major Eastern Hatches", is a "how to" masterpiece. Henry will also be guiding attendees and sharing his expert knowledge. Also joining us will be expert guide Bill Anderson. Bill is president of the Little Juniata River Association, an innovative fly tyer, National Finalist for the Field & Stream "Hero of Conservation" award 2014, and Outdoor News – Person of the Year for 2015. He has most recently contributed the chapter for the Little Juniata in a newly released book titled "50 Best Places Fly Fishing the Northeast" – Stonefly Press. Bill has also written a newly released book, titled "Trout Boomer and the Little 'j'" - The story of a fly fisher and his love for the Little Juniata River". His innovative fly pattern, the CET (Crippled Emerger Transformer) was developed over several decades of observing and fishing the hatches on the little Juniata River.
