PHYSICIAN PAYMENT SUNSHINE ACT

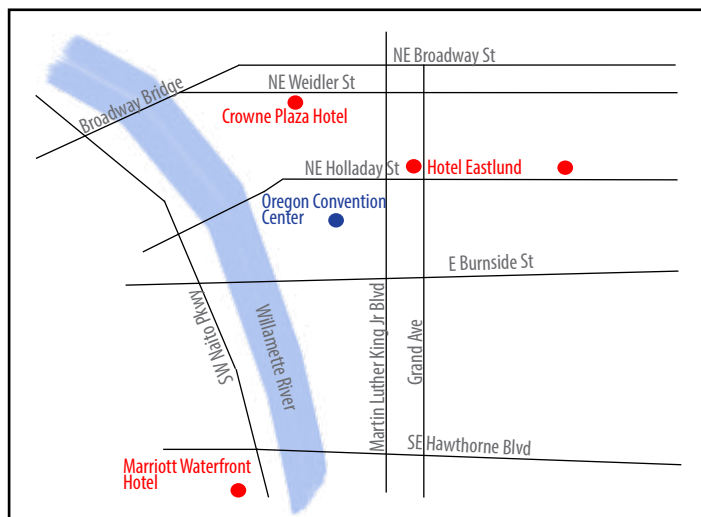

Weather

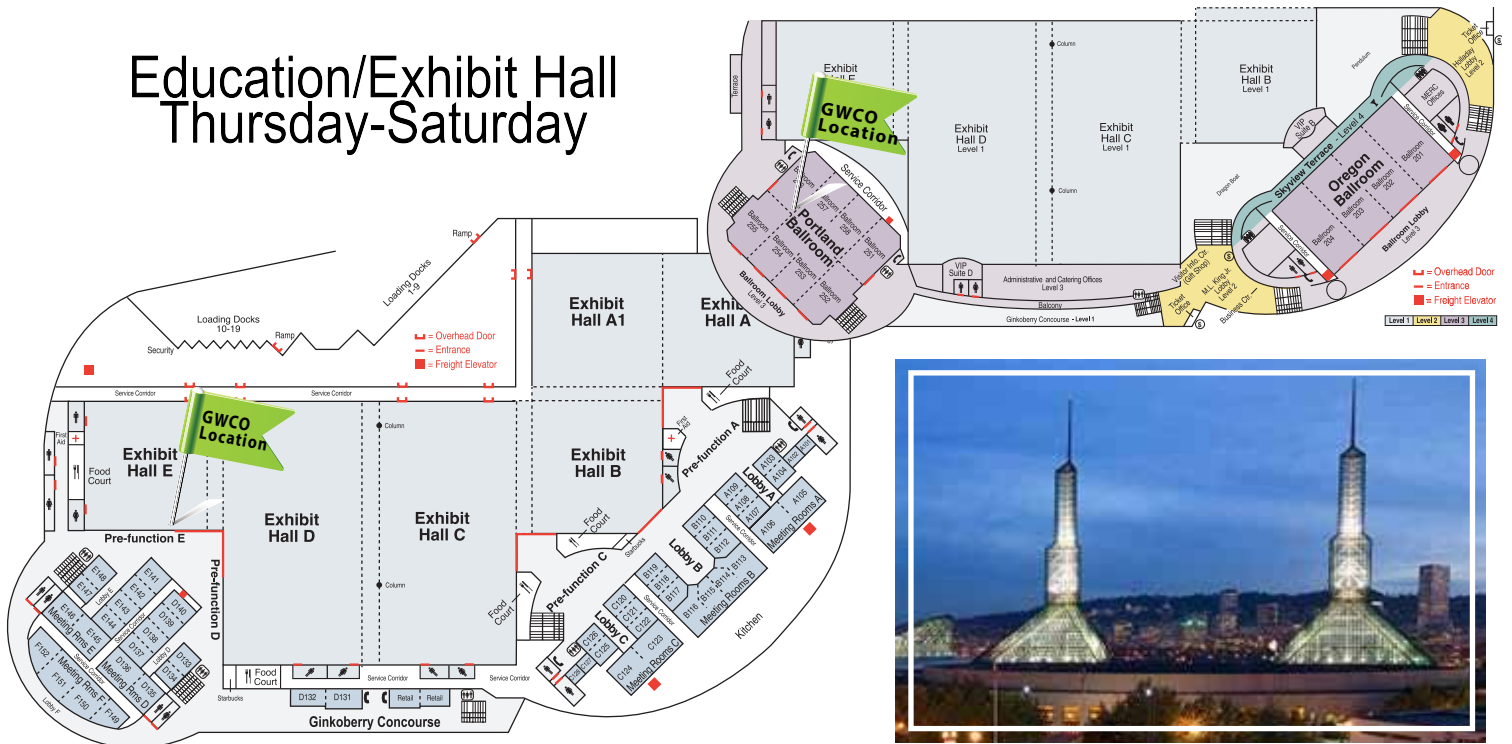
Portland weather in the Fall is mild with average highs at 76 degrees F and lows at 54 degrees F.

Don Jarnigan, OD, of Arizona, recently retired as Dean of the Arizona Optometric College, Midwestern University. Dr. Jarnigan's tireless devotion and leadership of the Arizona Optometric College is why the college is recognized as one of the finest colleges and/or schools of optometry today!

Prior to being appointed as an interim-Dean and educator at the Arizona Optometric College in 2007 and Dean in 2010, Dr. Jarnigan was actively engaged in private practice for 37 years (since 1970) in Glendale, Arizona. 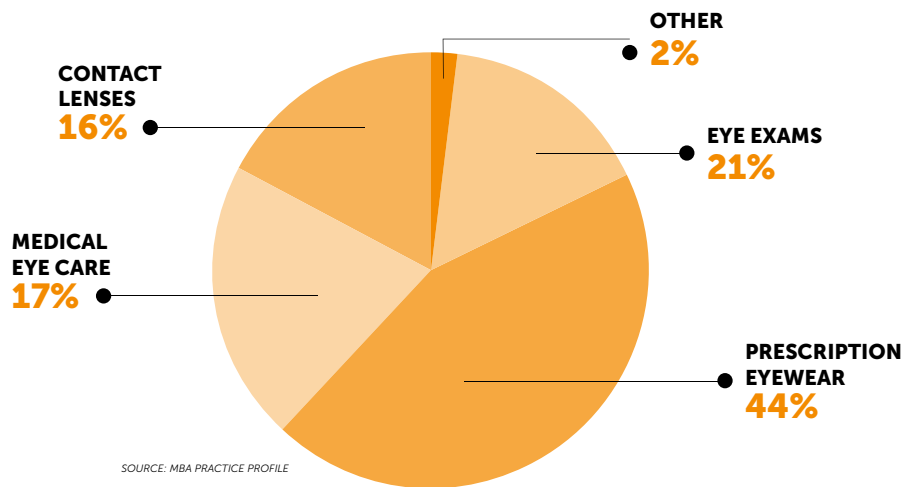
