# TRIBUTE TO A LEADER



### William Marcolini, OD, FAAO


Class of '01

Follow I-95 North to I-76 West (Schuylkill Expressway). Follow I-76 West to Exit 340B (Route 1 North — Roosevelt Boulevard).

Follow Route 1 North and exit at Broad Street. Turn left onto Broad Street and drive 20 blocks. Bear right onto Route 611 North (Old York Road) and drive approximately 2 1/2 miles. Turn left onto Route 73 West (Township Line Road). Turn left at first light onto Breyer Drive.

Follow signs for Salus University's campus and parking.

### From the North and West via Pennsylvania Turnpike

Follow the Pennsylvania Turnpike to Exit 339 (Fort Washington — Route 309).

At the first traffic light, turn left onto Greenwood Avenue — carefully follow the road past the Jenkintown train station and over a bridge.


At the next traffic light, bear right onto Route 73 East (Township Line Road).
