Dr. Autry received her pharmacy degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She practiced in critical care before returning for her optometry degree at the University of Houston. Following graduation, she performed a residency in ocular disease at the Eye Center of Texas ophthalmology center where she is a partner today. Dr. Autry lectures nationally and internationally on a variety of pharmaceutical and ocular disease topics and has authored numerous articles for both optometric and pharmaceutical journals.

Dr. Derek Cunningham



Dr. Cunningham is the Director of Optometry and Research at Dell Laser Consultants in Austin, Texas. His research involves retinal drug treatments, glaucoma surgery techniques, ocular surface disease, and refractive surgery. Previously Dr. Cunningham was the resident education supervisor at the Division of Ophthalmology, Texas Tech School of Medicine at El Paso and clinic director for a surgery co-management center in Alabama.

Dr. Cunningham is a founding member of the Integrated Ophthalmic Managed Eye Care Delivery Task Force by the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery. He is the chief medical editor of Optometry’s only pathology based publication – Advanced Ocular Care. He is also the author of The Surgical Minute column in Review of Optometry and the host of Innovations in Clinical Practice video series on Eyetubeod.com.

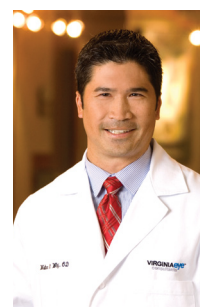
Dr. James Thimons, O.D, FAAO.



Dr. Thimons is a 1978 graduate of Ohio State University College of Optometry. He completed his hospital residency at the Chillicothe, VA Medical Center in 1979 and then served as Chief, Optometry Service until 1985. He then accepted the position of Center Director at Omni Eye Services, Fairfax, Virginia and served in that role until 1989 when he became Chairman, Department of Clinical Sciences. While at SUNY he developed The Glaucoma Institute at the State University of New York, a glaucoma clinical research center, and served as its first Director. In 1998, he accepted the position of Executive Director of TLC and served in that role until 2002 when he co-founded Ophthalmic Consultants of Connecticut. A multidisciplinary referral practice providing secondary and tertiary level care!

Dr. Thimons has received numerous awards for his service to the profession and has over 200 hundred publications in the area of ocular disease management. He is a nationally and internationally acclaimed Speaker and Educator and an acknowledged leader in ophthalmic clinical education. He serves in professorial appointments at several universities in the US and has been a clinical investigator in over 20 NIH, NEI and Post Release Clinical Trials. In 1999 he was awarded Optometry’s Top Educator and was selected as one of the Top Ten ODs of the decade. In 2002 he founded the National Glaucoma Society, a NFP with Executive offices in Andover, Massachusetts, that provides educational and clinical development services to primary care clinicians worldwide in the area of glaucoma. In 2005 he was inducted into the Optometry Hall of Fame and has recently served as President, Connecticut Association of Optometrists.

Dr. Walter Whitley, OD, MBA, FAAO.



Dr. Walter Whitley is a graduate of Pacific University College of Optometry. Dr. Whitley serves as director of Optometric Services at internationally recognized Virginia Eye Consultants in Norfolk, Virginia where his practice encompasses ocular surface disease, glaucoma, surgical co-management, clinical research and the supervision of an extensive referral network. He completed an optometric residency in ocular disease, refractive and ocular surgery at Eye Care Associates of Nevada. Dr. Whitley is an adjunct assistant clinical professor for several optometry including Pacific University, Salus University, Southern California College of Optometry, Southern College of Optometry and the University of the Incarnate Word. He is a recognized author and lecturer and has given over 100 lectures on various topics and ocular disease and refractive procedures. Recently Dr. Whitley was named the 2012 Young OD of the year for the Virginia Optometric Association.
