3 PM - 4 PM A Nutritional Approach to Treating Dry Eyes (Anshel/COPE #: 25117-AS)

Recent studies show that over 158 million consumers spend \$23.7 billion a year on nutritional supplements. Many patients prefer the "natural" approach to their eye condition. This course will present an in-depth review of the science of nutraceuticals in the care and prevention of many of the eye conditions that present to the office on a daily basis. FALL CONGRESS FACULTY

DR. JEFFREY ANSHEL is a 1975 graduate from the Illinois College of Optometry. He has written numerous articles regarding nutritional influences on vision, stress factors that affect visual performance and computer vision concerns. Dr. Anshel has published several books related to vision in the workplace as well as consumer-friendly reference books. Dr. Anshel is the principal of Corporate Vision Consulting, where he addresses the issues surrounding visual demands while working with computers. He offers on-site consultations and seminars to eyecare professionals and corporations related to visual stress in the workplace. Dr. Anshel is also the current president and founder of the Optometric Nutrition Society. He lectures extensively on nutrition and vision issues. He has been an Assistant Professor at the Southern California College of Optometry in Fullerton, CA and currently maintains a full service practice in Carlsbad, California. Dr. Anshel is a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry.

DR. MARK T. DUNBAR graduated from the Ferris State College of Optometry in 1986 and did a Fellowship in Ocular Disease at the Omni Eye Services of Lexington, KY. Dr. Dunbar has been a member of the optometric staff at the University of Miami's Bascom Palmer Eye Institute for over 22 years. He currently serves as the Director of Optometric Services and the Optometry Residency Supervisor. Dr. Dunbar is a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and is a founding member of both the Optometric Glaucoma Society (OGS) and the Optometric Retina Society (ORS). Dr. Dunbar also serves on the Editorial Board for Review of Optometry and currently writes the monthly Retina Quiz. In the state of Florida, Dr Dunbar has served as a member of the Topical Ocular Pharmaceutical Advisory (TOPA) Committee since 1991. Dr. Dunbar has lectured both nationally and internationally including the American Academy of Optometry's annual meeting, the AOA Congress, and SECO International.

DR. CHRISTINE W. SINDT is a 1994 graduate of The Ohio State University College of Optometry. She completed a disease based residency at the Cleveland VA Medical Center. Dr. Sindt joined the Faculty of the University of Iowa Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences in 1995, where she is currently an Associate Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology and Director of the Contact Lens Service. Dr Sindt is a Fellow in the Academy of Optometry. She is the 2010-2011 Chair of the AOA Cornea and Contact Lens Council, President of Women of Vision and Vice President of the Scleral Lens Education Society. Dr. Sindt is Chief Clinical Editor for Review of Optometry and an Associate Editor for Review of Cornea and Contact Lens.

EDWARD J. QUINLAN, M.D. graduated from the University of Nebraska Medical Center in 1994. He completed his Ophthalmology residency at West Virginia University Medical Center and a 2 year Vitreoretinal fellowship at the Wilmer Eye Institute of the Johns Hopkins Hospitals in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Quinlan was on the faculty of the Wilmer Eye Institute as an Assistant Professor of Ophthalmology from 2002-2007. During his time at the Wilmer Eye Institute, Dr. Quinlan served as a principal investigator and co-investigator in numerous clinical trials. His research involved the investigation of new treatments for retinal diseases including age-related macular degeneration and diabetic retinopathy and has led to publications in peer reviewed journals. In addition Dr. Quinlan has participated in the training of other retinal specialists. He is a member of the American Society of Retinal Specialists and the Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology.
