Ryan P. Ames, O.D.

Dr. Ames is the managing owner of Northshore Eye Care, a three doctor, two location practice in Oshkosh & Omro, Wisconsin. He sees patients on a daily basis for everything from general medical eye exams and contact lenses to glaucoma and AMD. As the managing owner, he has been directly involved in the coding and billing challenges facing an optometric practice. He also man-

ages a medical technology co-op where private practices share a GDx among the group. He has lectured on billing & coding and is involved in answering questions for PMI clients and AOA members.

He is the chair for the New Members Committee of the Wisconsin Optometric Association and also serves on the board of directors for the association. Dr. Ames has also served as the president of his local WOA society.



Mile Brujic, O.D.

Dr. Brujic graduated from the New England College of Optometry in 2002. He is a member of the Bowling Green Rotary Club. He is also a member of the Toledo Optometric Association, the Ohio Optometric Association and the American Optometric Association. He practices full scope optometry with special interest in contact lenses and ocular disease management of the ante-

rior segment and glaucoma. He publishes in numerous optometric publications and is on the editorial board for Optometry Times. Dr. Brujic has lectured internationally to eye care practitioners on contemporary topics in eye care. He is also a clinical examiner for the national board of examiners in optometry.



James Colgain, O.D.

Dr. Colgain is a native of Bethesda, MD, and a 1983 graduate of the Illinois College of Optometry. He is the Clinical Director for the USAF Warfighter Eye Center at Andrews Air Force Base and the past National Director of Professional Care for TLC Laser Eye Centers, a 60 center international provider of laser vision correction and referral based eye care services. Dr. Colgain is

an adjunct faculty for four Colleges of Optometry and has provided over 200 lectures on ophthalmic lenses, ocular disease, practice management, refractive surgery and authored numerous clinical articles. Dr. Colgain began his career as a USAF scholarship recipient, serving five years in a hospital-based practice. After leaving active duty, Dr. Colgain was recruited to pioneer Kaiser Permanente's Mid Atlantic Region's Eye Care Services as the Chief of Optometry. He has been selected as the Optometrist of the Year in Optometrist of the Year in Maryland, the District of Columbia and the Air National Guard.



Jay W. Henry, O.D., M.S.

Dr. Henry obtained both his Doctor of Optometry and his Master of Science Degrees from The Ohio State University. Dr. Henry is a Clinical Assistant Professor as well as a Primary Care Extern Preceptor for The Ohio State University College of Optometry. He is currently a partner at Hermann and Henry Eyecare, a group private practice near Columbus, Ohio.

Dr. Henry speaks nationally and has published numerous articles on topics related to EHR, paperless practices, technology, e-prescribing, PQRS (formerly PQRI) and ocular disease. Dr. Henry was the first optometrist in the nation to use optometric specific software for e-prescribing. He serves on the AOA's Health Information Technology Committee. Dr. Henry helped create the AOA's EHR Affiliate CE Program and is known nationally for his expert knowledge of the Federal incentive programs, Federal legislation, Advanced technologies used in eye care and EHRs.



John A. McGreal Jr., O.D.

Dr. McGreal is a graduate of Albright College and the Pennsylvania College of Optometry. He was Chief of Eye Services at Greater Atlantic Health service in Philadelphia, where he also had a private practice. He was a founding partner in Vision Care Consultants, a managed eye care company in Pennsylvania. He was Center Director and Vice President for Vision America Incorporated for

seven years. Currently, he is Director of the Missouri Eye Associates, a medical and surgical private practice in St. Louis.

He is adjunct faculty at the University of California, Berkeley School of Optometry, the Pennsylvania College of Optometry and the University of Missouri. He is internationally recognized for his educational endeavors. He served on the continuing education committee for the North Central States Optometric Council and is past member of the Congress continuing education subcommittee of the American Optometric Association. He was the 42nd Peter's Memorial Lecturer at the University of California. He was the Nussenblatt Lecturer at the University of Houston in 2004. He was the 1998 Missouri Optometrist of the Year. He was the 2005 University Of Missouri School Of Optometry Educator of the Year. He is Director of Education of ODExcellence, a practice improvement company.
