From the Education Planning Committee Chair



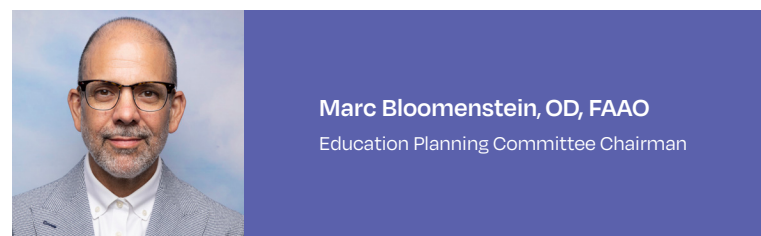
